

# JAMAICA TOURIST BOARD

- IN FEBRUARY 2006.....**
- Stopover arrivals up by 12.5%
  - US Market increased by 12.9%
  - Canada increased by 24%
  - Europe increased by 6.1%
  - Cruise Passenger arrivals up by 5.2%

## TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in February 2006 were again at a record level of **138,428**, an increase of **12.5%** over the **123,022** recorded in February 2005.

For the January to February period, arrivals increased by **12.2%** with **269,123** compared to **239,866** in 2005.

### United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market increased by **12.9%** in February with a total of **96,072** visitors compared to the **85,124** visitors who came in February 2005. All marketing regions recorded increases. The South increased by **25.5%**, the West by **18.8%**, the Northeast by **9.8%** and the Midwest by **8.3%**.

For the January to February period, the US market increased by **15.2%**. Total visitors from that market was **183,598** compared to **159,339** for the corresponding period in 2005. All marketing regions recorded growth. The South increased by **31.9%**, the West by **25.3%**, the Northeast by **10.6%** and the Midwest by **9.3%**.

### Canada

In February, the Canadian market increased by an impressive **24%**. Total stopovers arrivals from the Canadian market in February were **17,982** compared to **14,500** in 2005.

The leading province of Ontario increased by **25.4%**, while the second most important visitor-producing province of Quebec decreased by less than **1%**. Other notable increases were Newfoundland **202%**, New Brunswick **105%**, and British Columbia **58%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market increased by **16.5%** in the January to February period with a total of **35,775**

stopovers compared to **30,720** in 2005. The main province of Ontario with **23,569** arrivals increased by **24.7%**. The provinces of Quebec and Alberta declined by **4.3%** and **5%** respectively. The other notable increases were New Brunswick **85.9%**, Nova Scotia **59.2%** and Newfoundland **51.2%**.

### Europe

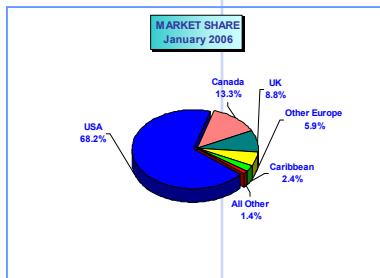
The European market recorded a **6.1%** increase in February 2006. The market provided a total of **19,535** stopover visitors compared to the **18,419** recorded in February 2005. The European market region has been divided into three marketing regions. In the Northern Europe region the main visitor producing country, United Kingdom with **11,995** arrivals increased by **9.5%**. In the South/Western Europe region the main visitor producing countries, Germany with **2,333** increased by **24.2%** and Italy with **2,026** declined by **20.7%**. In the third market region, Central/East Europe with **401** arrivals, declined by **5.7%**.

For the two-month period, January to February, the European market increased by less than **1%**. Total stopovers for the period was **39,443** compared to **39,404** in 2005. In Northern Europe, the United Kingdom with **23,654** arrivals increased by **7.4%**. In South/Western Europe, Germany with **4,994** increased by **17.1%** and Italy with **3,882** declined by **33.4%**. In the third market region, Central/East Europe with **1,050** arrivals, declined by **4.6%**.

### Latin America

The Latin American market increased by **30%** in February with a total of **845** stopovers compared to **650** in February 2005. From the Central American region, Mexico with **170** arrivals increased by **65%** and Panama with **107** increased by **25.9%**. From South America, Argentina with **110** arrivals increased by **266.7%** and Brazil with **90** decreased by **10.9%**.

For the January to February period, the Latin American market increased by **39.6%** with a total of **1,843** visitors compared to **1,320** for the corresponding period in 2005.



## The Caribbean

Visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region decreased by **10.2%** in February with a total of **2,982** visitors, compared to **3,320** in February 2005.

The major Caribbean countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in February were: the Cayman Islands (**934**), Trinidad and Tobago (**414**), Barbados (**308**), and the Bahamas (**173**).

Cumulatively, the Caribbean stopovers arrivals to Jamaica in the January to February period declined by **8.4%**, moving from **7,070** in 2005 to **6,475** in 2006. The Cayman Islands is the leading provider of visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region. In the period under review, they provided a total of **1,851** visitors followed by Trinidad and Tobago with **1,072**, Barbados with **702** and the Bahamas with **345** visitors.

## Japan

The Japanese market declined by **17.8%** in February with a total of **434** stopovers compared to **528** in February 2005.

Cumulatively for the January to February period, a total of **833** Japanese visitors came to Jamaica. This was down from the **850** recorded for the corresponding period in 2005.

## Other Countries

Of the other countries, Australia with **126** stopovers in February increased by **13.5%** against the **111** who came in 2005.

## Market Share

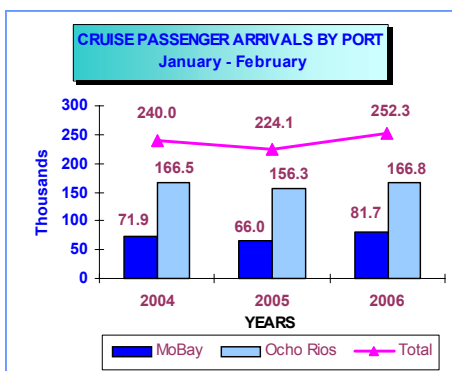
The market share of stopover visitors for February were as follows:

USA **67.0%**; Canada **13.6%**; UK **9.4%**; Continental Europe **5.8%**, the Caribbean **2.7%**; Latin America **0.8%**; Japan **0.3%** and Other Countries **0.4%**.

## Cruise Passengers

A total of **118,051** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in February 2006. This represents a **5.2%** increase against the **112,261** recorded for February 2005.

Cumulatively, a total of **252,330** cruise passengers visited our shores in the January to February period, an increase of **12.6%** against the **224,102** recorded for the corresponding period in 2005.



A total of **80,315** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios in February, an increase of **5.3%** over the **76,240** recorded for February 2005.

For the January to February period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Ocho Rios was **166,813**, an increase of **6.7%** against the **156,294** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

Montego Bay recorded a total of **36,134** cruise passengers for the month, an increase of **2.8%** against the **35,147** recorded for 2005.

Cumulatively, for the January to February period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Montego Bay was **81,672**, an increase of **23.8%** against the **65,964** recorded for the same period in 2005.

## Length of Stay

The average length of stay of **Foreign National** arrivals in February was **9** nights compared to the **8.8** nights in February 2005. Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to February period was **9.3** nights, this is the same level recorded in 2005.

The average length of stay of **Non-Resident Jamaican** arrivals in February was **16.6** nights compared to the **20.1** nights in February 2005. Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to February period was **17.3** nights, compared to **20.9** nights in 2005.

## Purpose of Visit

During period under review, January to February 2006, **83.3%** or **214,340** of the **257,509** Foreign Nationals who visited Jamaica were visiting for the purpose of Leisure, **6%** were on Business, **5.1%** were Visiting Friends & Relatives, and the remaining **4.6%** were on Other purposes of travel.

A total of **4,734** or **40.7%** of the **11,614** Non-Resident Jamaicans who travelled to Jamaica in this period January to February 2006 were visiting for Leisure, **24%** were visiting Friends & Relatives, **12.7%** were on Business and the remaining **22.6%** were on Other purposes of travel.

## Intended Resort Area of Stay

Of the **269,123** stopover arrivals visiting Jamaica in during January and February 2006, the resort area of Montego Bay welcomed **77,683** arrivals or **28.9%**. Ocho Rios received **66,711** or **24.8%**, Negril got **62,052** or **23.1%**, and Kingston got **29,591** or **11%**. The remaining **12.3%** stayed in the Mandeville/Southcoast, Port Antonio resort regions and Other areas in Jamaica.

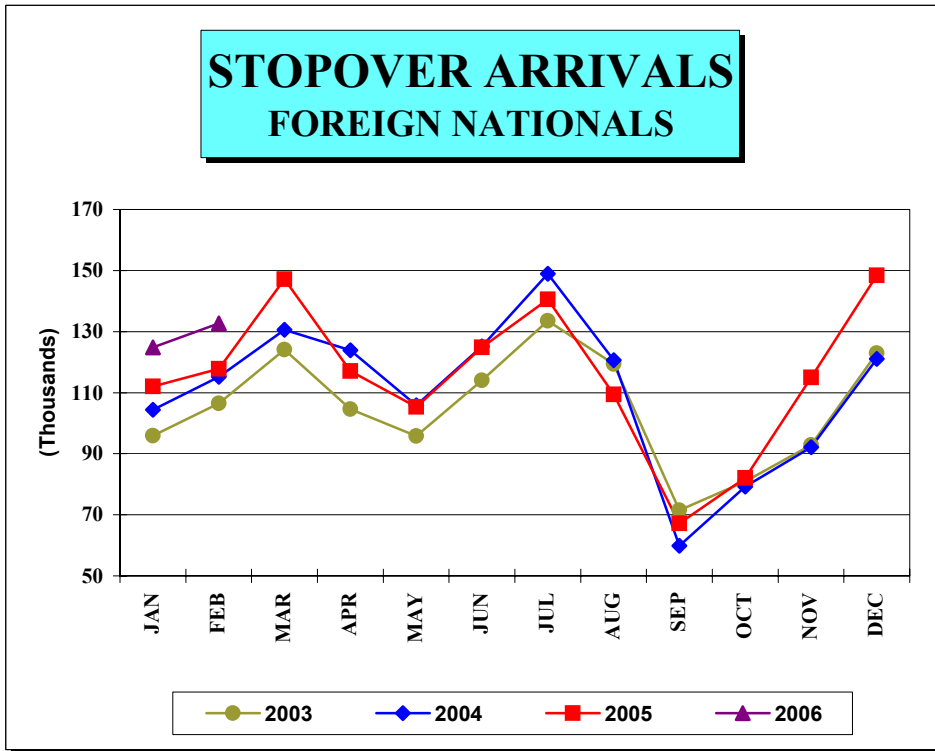

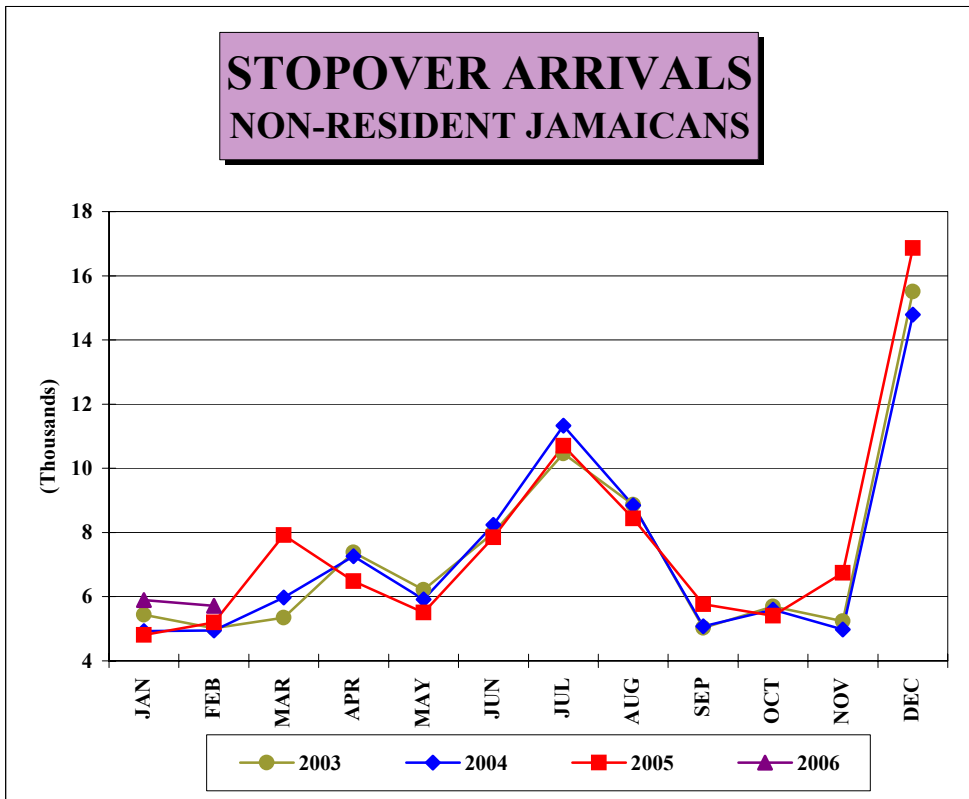
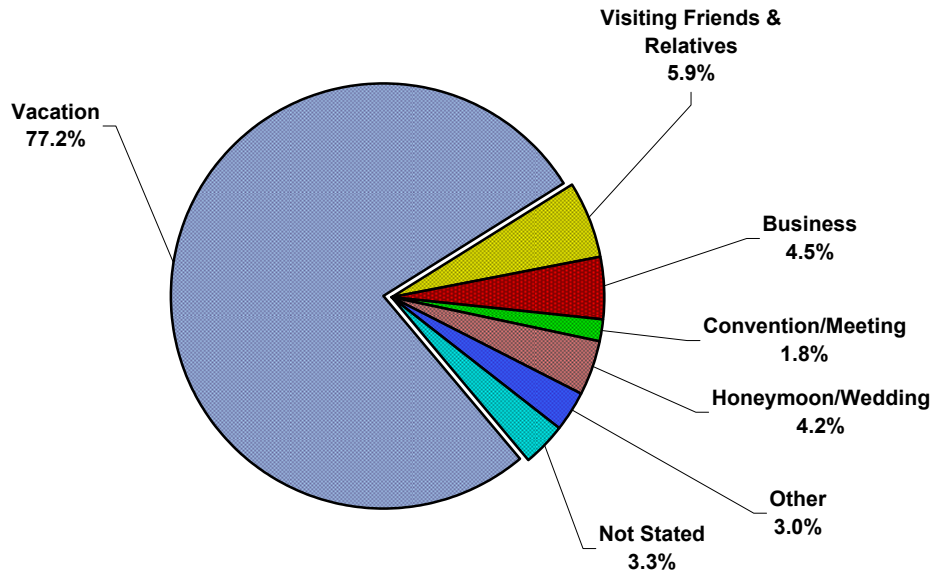

## STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

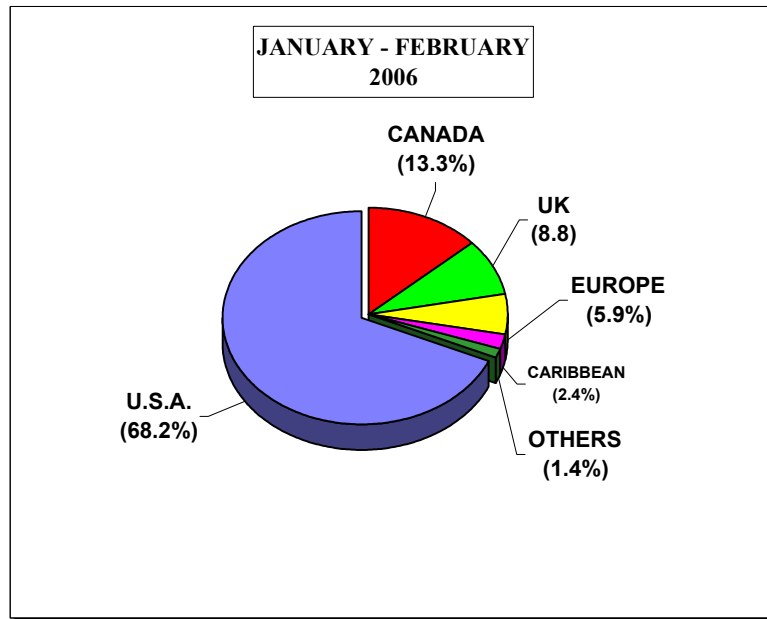

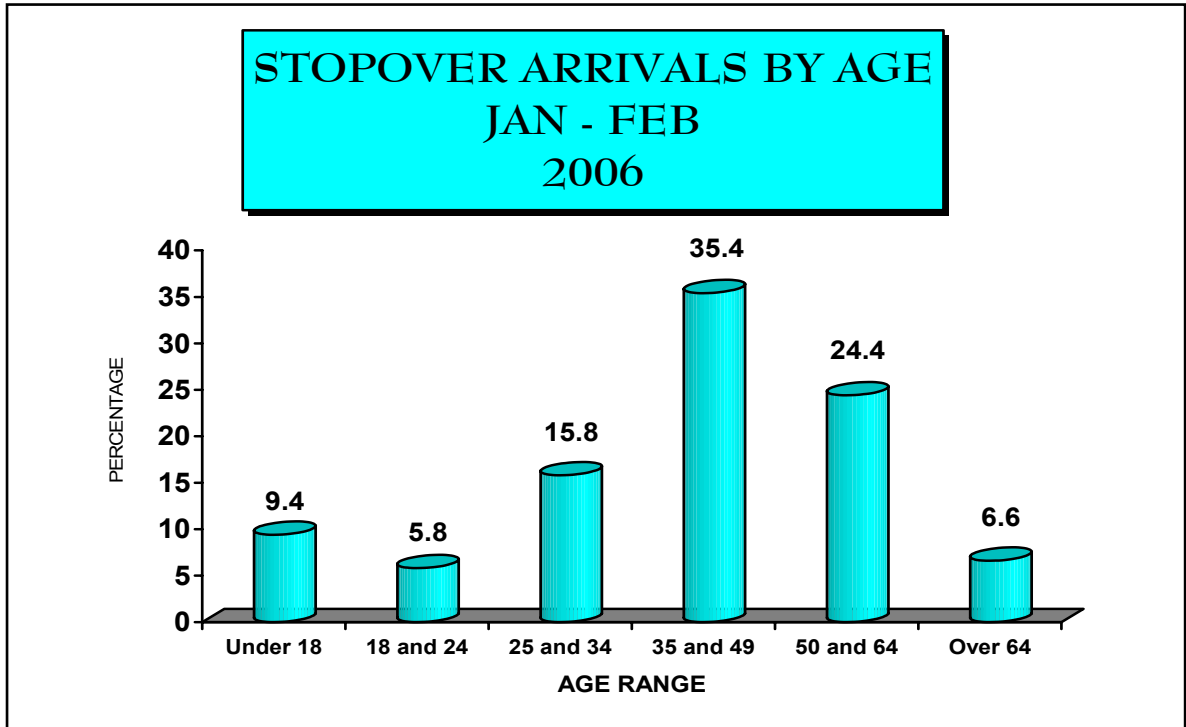

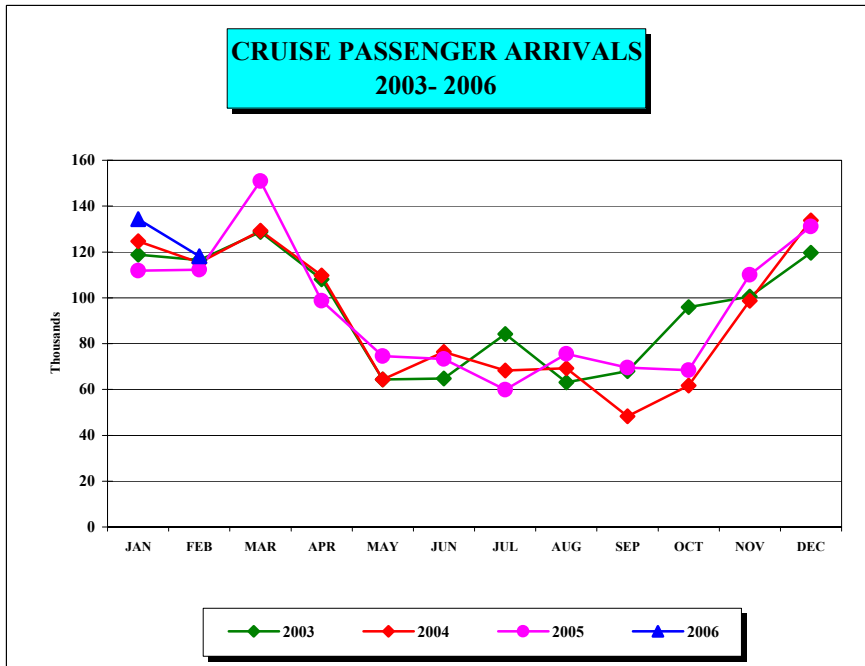

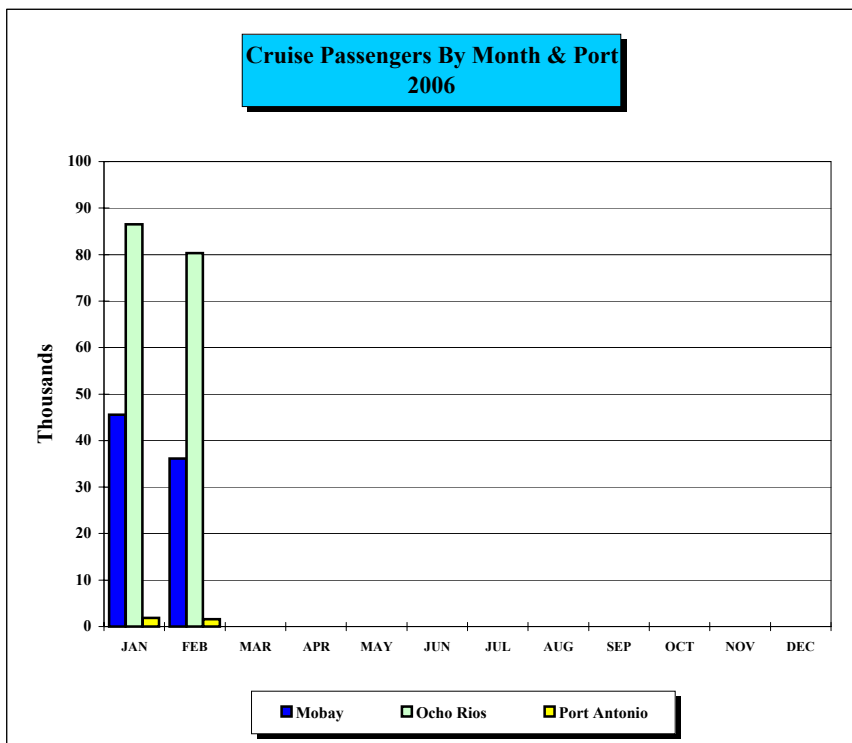

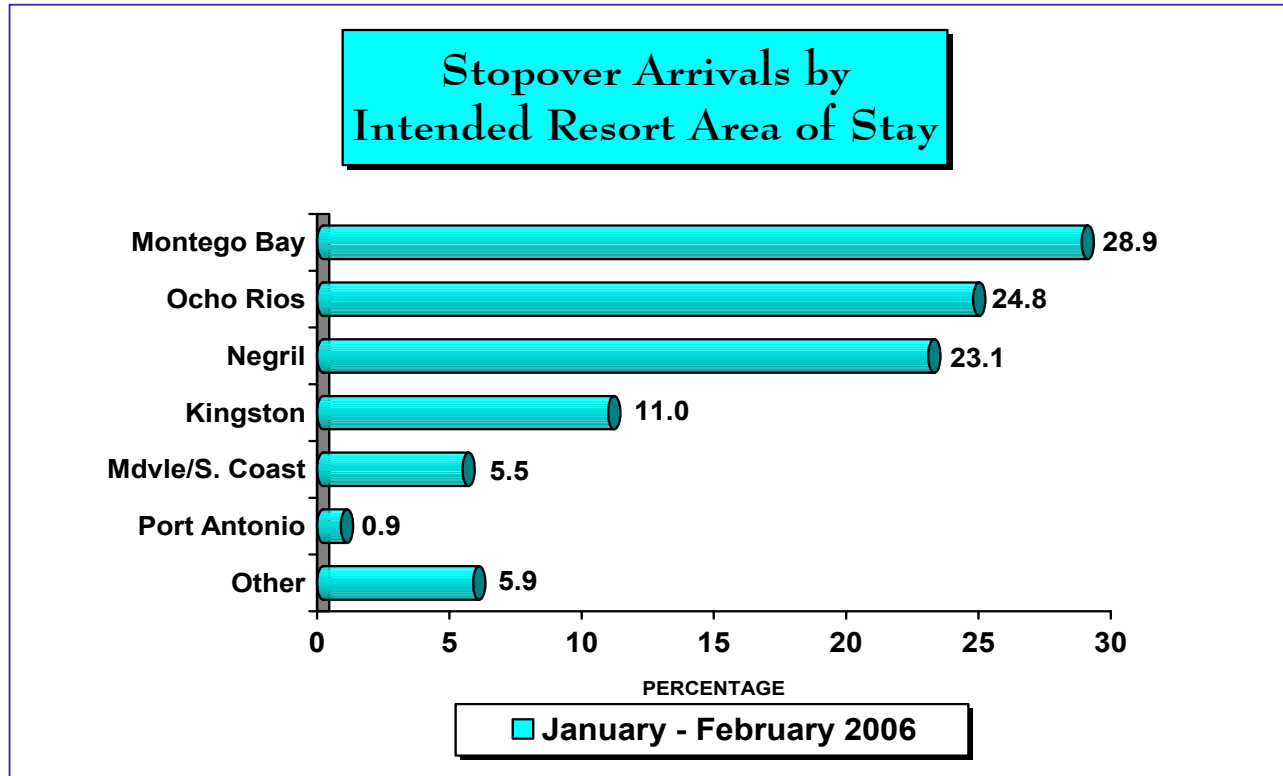
