

JAMAICA TOURIST BOARD

- IN FEBRUARY 2008.....**
- Stopover arrivals up by 18%

TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in February 2008 were **156,831**, an increase of **18%** over the **132,949** recorded in February 2007.

United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market increased by **17%** in February with a total of **96,732** visitors compared to the **82,659** visitors who came in February 2007. All marketing regions recorded double digit increases. The South increased by **25%**, the West by **18.8%**, the Northeast by **15.4%** and the Midwest by **13.7%**.

For the January to February period, the US market has recorded an increase of **11.6%**. This is a reversal from the **11.9%** decline recorded during the same period in 2007 compared to 2006. Total visitors from this market was **180,545** compared to **161,740** in 2007. All marketing regions recorded increases. The South increased by **17.5%**, The West by **11.9%**, the Northeast by **11.5%**, and the Midwest by **7.4%**.

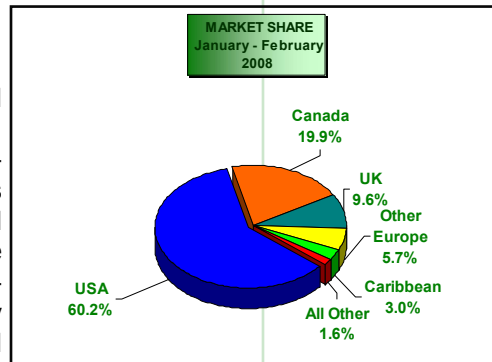
Canada

In February, the Canadian market grew by an impressive **32.4%**. Total stopovers from Canada were **30,646** compared to **23,144** in February 2007.

The leading province of Ontario increased by **31.2%**, while the second most important visitor-producing province of Quebec increased by **45.6%**. Increases were also recorded for the provinces of Alberta up by **14.8%**, Saskatchewan up by **76%** and Manitoba up by **24.5%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market continued on its exceptional growth trend recording an increase of **29.8%** in

the January to February period with a total of **59,671** stopovers compared to **45,987** in 2007. The top visitor producing provinces of Ontario with **33,486** and Quebec with **9,360** increased by **27.6%** and **33%** respectively. The provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia increased by **28.2%**, **60.6%** and **15.2%** respectively.



Europe

The European market recorded a **3%** increase in February 2008. The market provided a total of **22,872** stopover visitors compared to the **22,214** recorded in February 2007. In the Northern European market region the main visitor producing country, United Kingdom with **14,534** arrivals increased by **2.2%**. In the South/Western Europe region the main

visitor producing countries, Germany with **1,937** declined by **12.2%** and Italy with **1,934** increased by **4.7%**. From the third market region, Central/East Europe with **964** arrivals, increased by **23.4%**.

For the January to February period, the European market increased by **3.2%**, Total stopovers was **45,799** compared to **44,380** in 2007. From the Northern European market region **30,185** arrivals increased by **5.4%**. From the South/Western Europe region, **13,599** arrivals a decrease of **2.5%**. From the third market region, Central/East **2,015** arrivals increased by **12.4%**.

Latin America

The Latin American market increased by **82.6%** in February with a total of **1,072** stopovers compared to **587** in February 2007. From the Central American region a total of **494** arrivals increased by **46.6%**. From South America, **578** arrivals increased by **131.2%**.

Cumulatively, for the January to February period, the Latin American market increased by **45%** with a total of **2,470** visitors compared to **1,703** for the corresponding period in 2007.

The Caribbean

Visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region increased by **23%** in February with a total of **4,366** visitors, compared to **3,550** in February 2007.

The major Caribbean countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in February were: the Cayman Islands (**1,378**), Trinidad and Tobago (**880**), Barbados (**349**), the Bahamas Is. (**303**), Bermuda (**205**) and Dominican Republic (**137**).

Cumulatively, the Caribbean stopover arrivals to Jamaica in the January to February period increased by **23.3%**, moving from **7,262** in 2007 to **8,953** in 2008. The Cayman Islands is the leading provider of visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region. In the period under review, they provided a total of **2,723** visitors followed by Trinidad & Tobago with **1,565**, Barbados with **701** and the Bahamas Is. with **670** visitors.

Asia

The Asian market increased by **48.7%** in February with a total of **690** stopovers compared to **464** in February 2007.

The major Asian countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in February were: Japan (**347**) up **3.6%**, India (**105**) up **162.5%**, and China (**79**) up **259.1%**.

Year-to-date, January to February the Asian market grew by **54.5%** with **1,312** arrivals compared to **849** arrivals in 2007.

Other Countries

Of the other countries, Australia with **173** and Israel with **110** increased by **10.2%** and **41%** in February against the **157** and **78** respectively who came in 2007.

Market Share

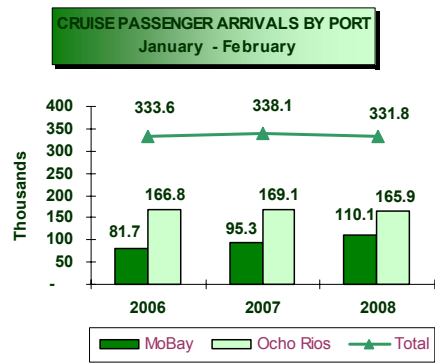
The market share of stopover visitors for the year-to-date period, January to February was as follows:

USA **60.2%**; Canada **19.9%**; UK **9.6%**; Continental Europe **5.7%**, the Caribbean **3%**; Latin America **0.8%**; Asia **0.5%** and Other Countries **0.3%**.

Cruise Passengers

A total of **133,403** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in February 2008. This represents a **8.3%** increase against the **123,130** recorded for February 2007.

Cumulatively, a total of **278,074** cruise passengers visited our shores in the January to February period, an increase of **4.2%** against the **266,858** recorded for the corresponding period in 2007.



A total of **85,393** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios in February, an increase of **9.3%** over the **78,104** recorded for February 2007.

For the January to February period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Ocho Rios were **165,888**, a decline of **1.9%** against the **169,062** recorded for the corresponding period in 2007.

Montego Bay recorded a total of **47,632** cruise passengers for the month, an increase of **8.4%** against the **43,921** recorded for 2007.

Cumulatively, for the January to February period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Montego Bay was **110,104**, an increase of **15.6%** against the **95,284** recorded for the corresponding period in 2007.

Length of Stay

The average length of stay of **Foreign National** arrivals in February was **8.5** nights compared to the **9.2** nights in February 2007. The average length of stay in hotels was **7.0** nights compared to **7.3** nights in February 2007.

Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to February period was **9**

nights as against the **9.7** nights recorded in 2007. In hotels the average length of stay during the period under review was **7.1** nights compared to **7.3** nights during 2007.

The average length of stay of **Non-Resident Jamaican** arrivals in February was **16.1** nights compared to the **15** nights in February 2007. The average length of stay in hotels was **8.5** nights compared to **7.7** nights in February 2007.

Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to February period was **16.9** nights as against the **16.1** nights recorded in 2007. In hotels the average length of stay during the period under review was **8.3** nights compared to **7.6** nights during 2007.

Purpose of Visit

Year-to-date, January to February 2008, **79.2%** or **222,849** of the **281,595** Foreign Nationals who visited Jamaica were visiting for the purpose of Leisure, **6.7%** were on Business, **7.4%** were Visiting Friends & Relatives, and the remaining **6.8%** were on Other purposes of travel.

A total of **5,732** or **31.7%** of the **18,097** Non-Resident Jamaicans who travelled to Jamaica in January to February 2008 were visiting for Leisure, **32.3%** were visiting Friends & Relatives, **8.8%** were on Business and the remaining **27.1%** were on Other purposes of travel.

Intended Resort Area of Stay

Of the **299,692** stopover arrivals visiting Jamaica in February 2007, the resort area of Montego Bay welcomed **82,937** arrivals or **27.7%**. Ocho Rios received **79,420** or **26.5%**, Negril got **64,110** or **21.4%**, and Kingston got **34,496** or **11.5%**. The remaining **13%** stayed in the Mandeville/Southcoast, Port Antonio resort regions and Other areas in Jamaica.

Type of Airlines used

Of the **299,692** stopover arrivals visiting Jamaica in February 2007, **236,912** or **79.1%** used scheduled airlines, while **62,780** or **20.9%** used chartered flights.

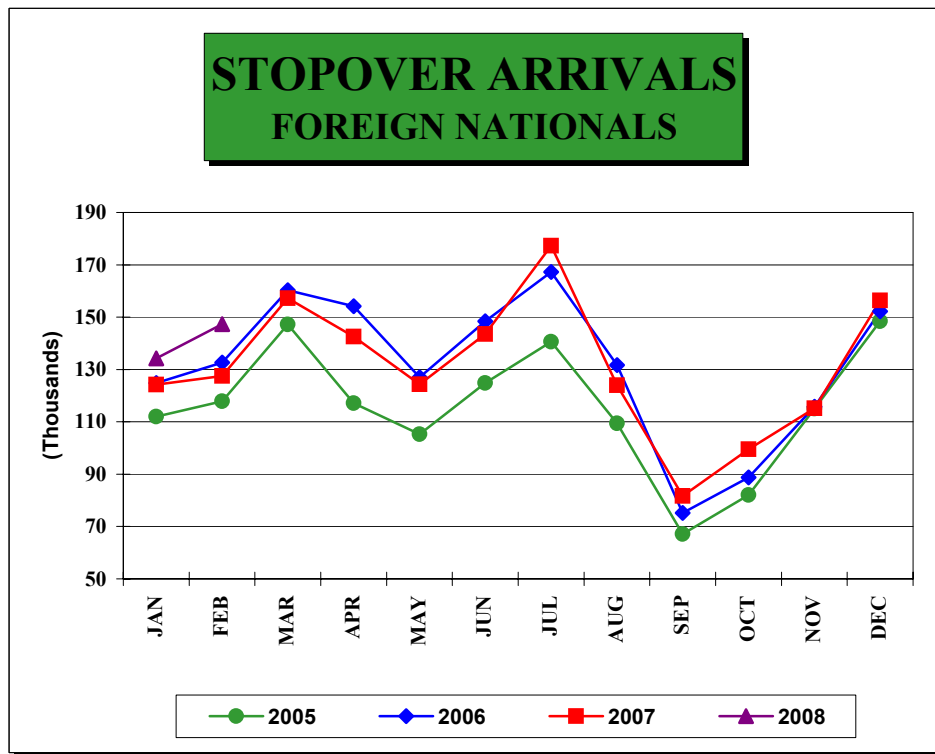

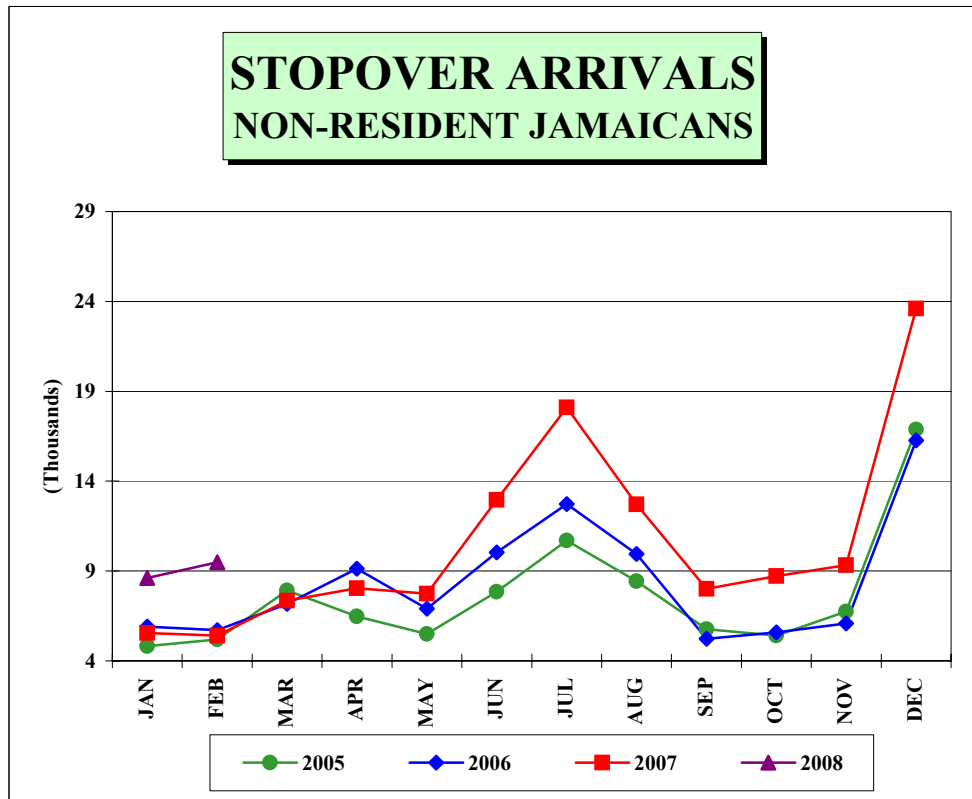

2008**

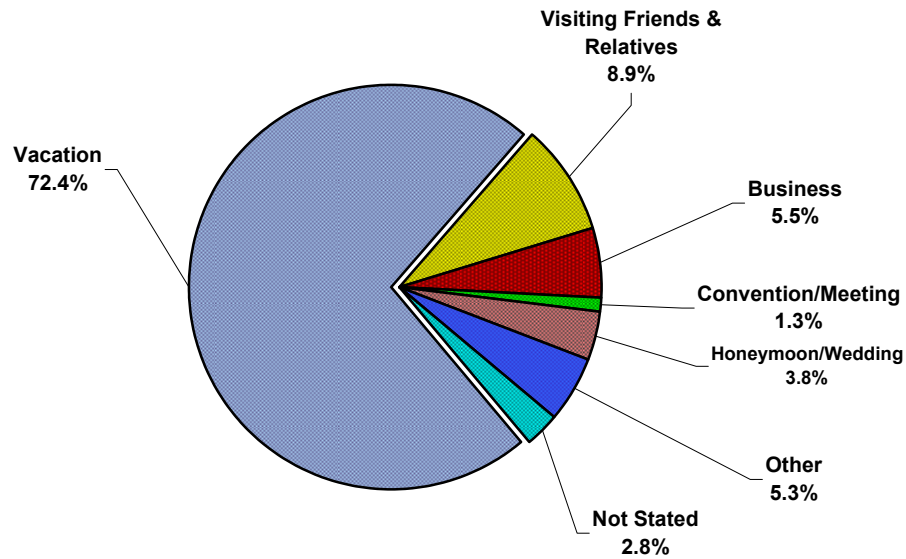

STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

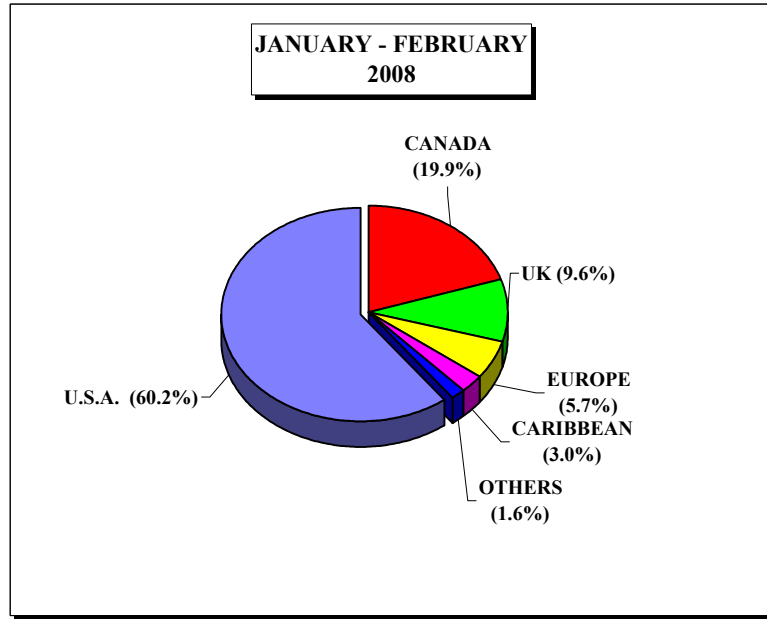

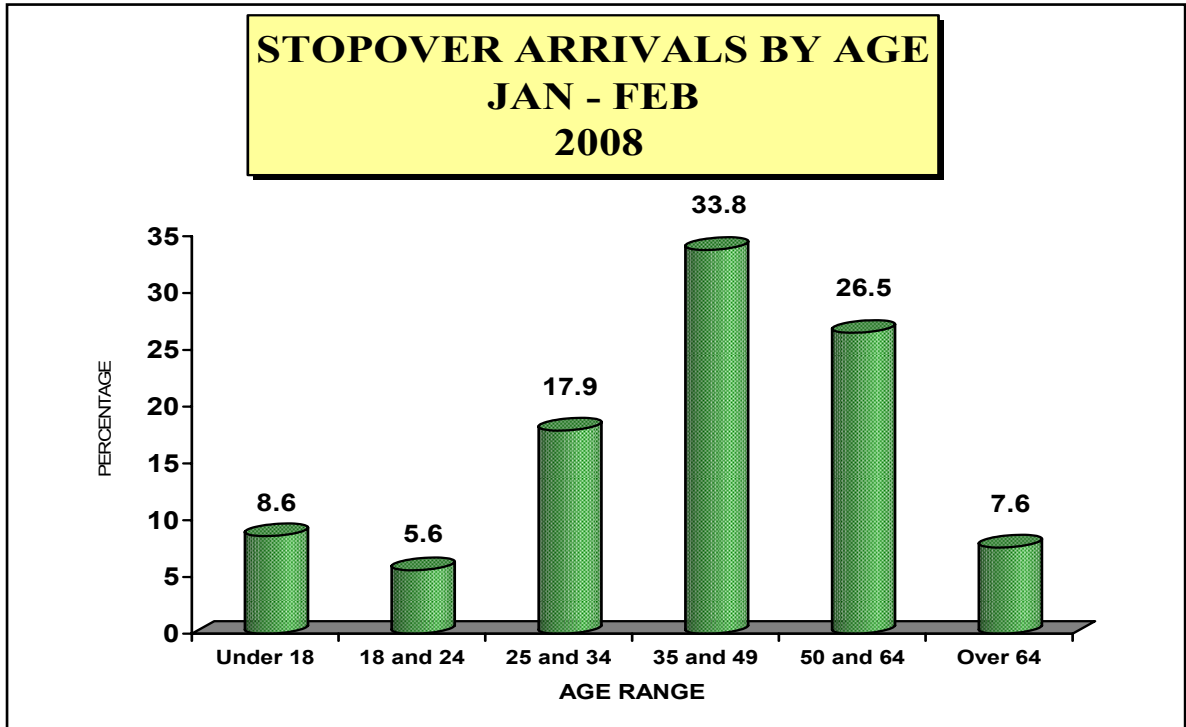

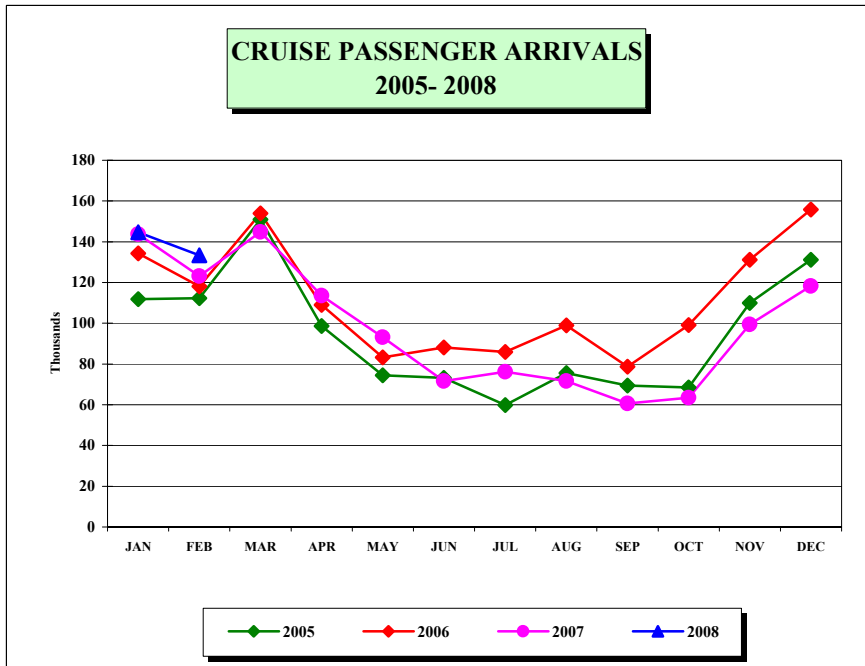

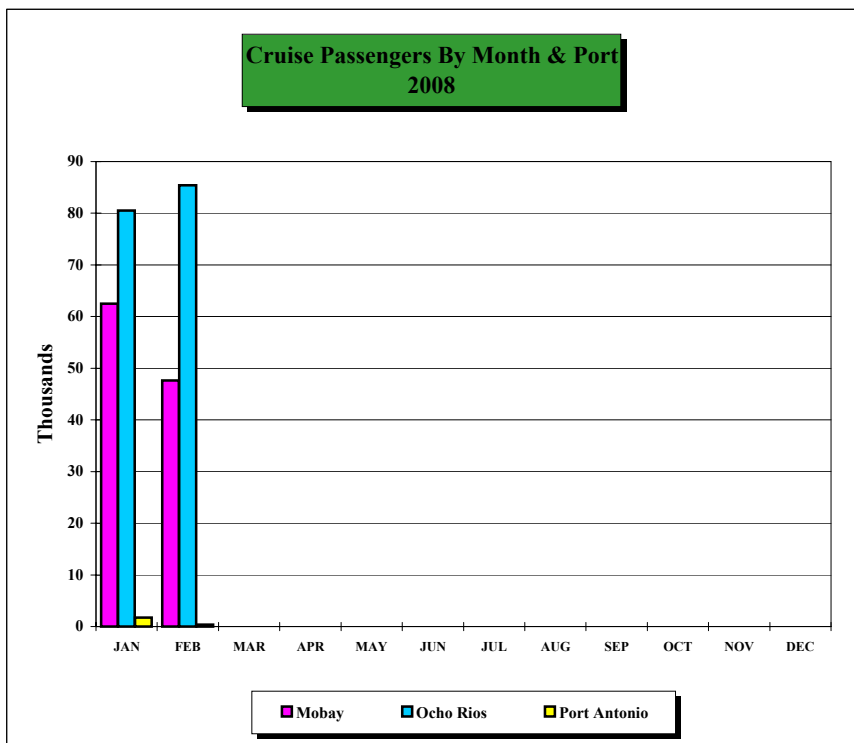

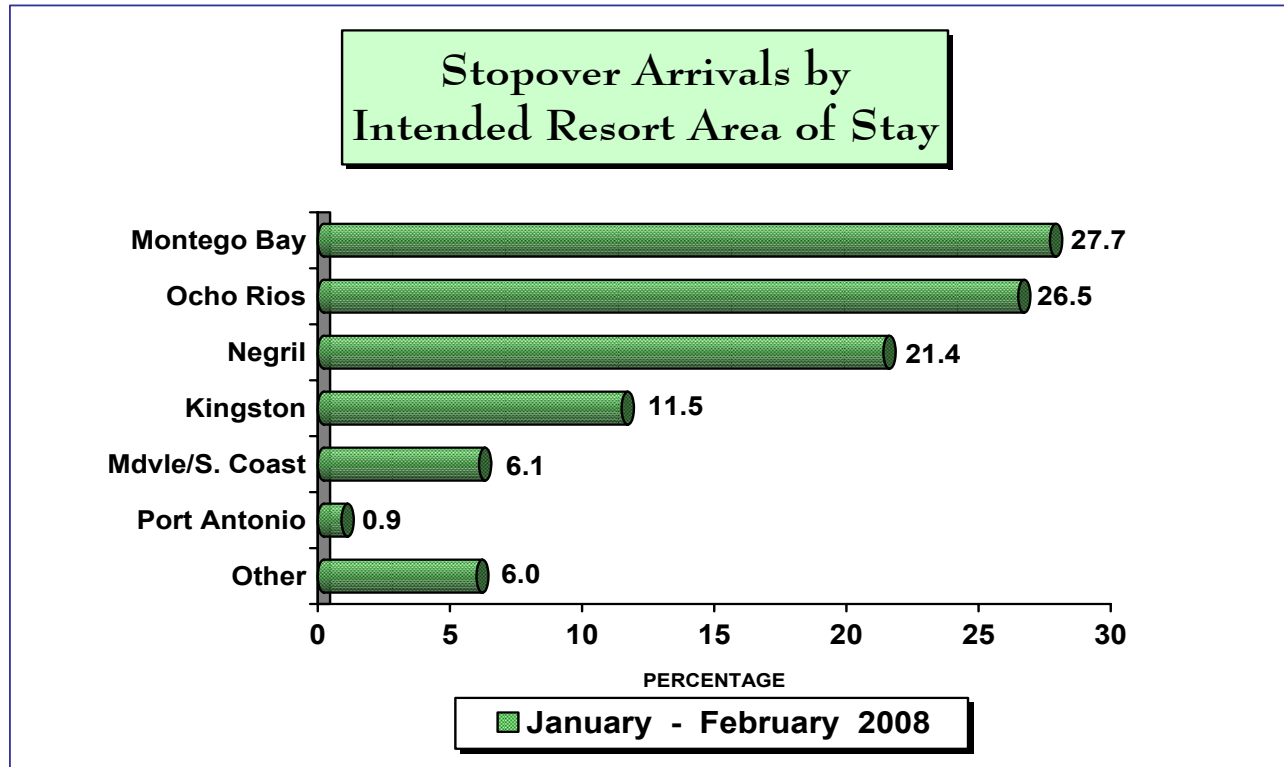
