TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in March 2006 were again at a record level of **167,439**, an increase of **8%** over the **155,103** recorded in March 2005.

For the first quarter of 2006, January to March, arrivals increased by **10.5%** with **436,562** compared to **394,690** in 2005.

United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market increased by **6.4%** in March with a total of **123,934** visitors compared to the **116,435** visitors who came in March 2005. With the exception of the Northeast region, which declined by **3%**, the remaining marketing regions recorded increases. The South increased by **22.8%**, the West by **17.8%**, and the Midwest by **4.8%**.

For the January to March period, the US market increased by **11.5%**. Total visitors from that market was **307,532** compared to **275,774** for the corresponding period in 2005. All marketing regions recorded growth. The South increased by **27.7%**, the West by **22.1%**, the Midwest by **7.5%**, and the Northeast by **4.9%**.

Canada

In March, the Canadian market increased by an outstanding **35.7%**. Total stopovers arrivals from the Canadian market in March were **17,657** compared to **13,008** in 2005.

The leading province of Ontario increased by **29.8%**, while the second most important visitor-producing province of Quebec increased by **59.5%**. Other notable increases were New Brunswick **102%**, Manitoba **42%**, and Alberta **23.7%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market increased by **22.2%** in the January to March period with a total of **43,728** stopovers compared to **37,252** in 2005. The main province of Ontario with **35,194** arrivals increased by **26.4%**. The provinces of Quebec and Alberta increased by **8.9%** and **2.7%** respectively. The other notable increases were New Brunswick **94%**, Nova Scotia **66.4%** and Manitoba **27.2%**.

Europe

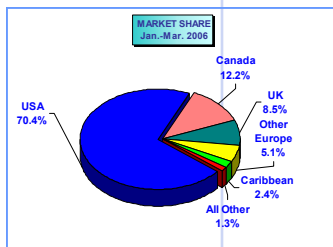
The European market recorded a **3.2%** increase in March 2006. The market provided a total of **20,173** stopover visitors compared to the **19,539** recorded in March 2005. In the Northern Europe region the main visitor producing country, United Kingdom with **12,556** arrivals increased by **8.3%**. In the South/Western Europe region the main visitor producing countries, Germany with **1,939** decreased by **11.5%** and Italy with **2,027** declined by **8.6%**. In the third market region, Central/East Europe with **273** arrivals, declined by **27.4%**.

For the first quarter period, January to March, the European market increased by **1.1%**. Total stopovers for the period was **59,616** compared to **58,943** in 2005. In Northern Europe, the United Kingdom with **37,252** arrivals increased by **7.7%**. In South/Western Europe, Germany with **6,933** increased by **7.4%** and Italy with **5,909** declined by **26.6%**. In the third market region, Central/East Europe with **1,323** arrivals, declined by **10.4%**.

Latin America

The Latin American market increased by **19.1%** in March with a total of **755** stopovers compared to **634** in March 2005. From the Central American region, Mexico with **161** arrivals increased by **19.3%** and Panama with **100** increased by **28.2%**. From South America, Argentina with **53** arrivals increased by **51.4%** and Brazil with **116** increased by **54.7%**.

For the January to March period, the Latin American market increased by **33%** with a total of **2,598** visitors compared to **1,954** for the corresponding period in 2005.



The Caribbean

Visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region decreased by **13.4%** in March with a total of **3,808** visitors, compared to **4,395** in March 2005.

The major Caribbean countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in March were: the Cayman Islands (**1,139**), Trinidad and Tobago (**580**), Barbados (**369**), and Bermuda (**366**).

Cumulatively, the Caribbean stopovers arrivals to Jamaica in the January to March period declined by **10.3%**, moving from **11,465** in 2005 to **10,283** in 2006. The Cayman Islands is the leading provider of visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region. In the period under review, they provided a total of **2,990** visitors followed by Trinidad and Tobago with **1,652**, Barbados with **1,071** and Bermuda with **671** visitors.

Japan

The Japanese market declined by **1.9%** in March with a total of **461** stopovers compared to **470** in March 2005.

Cumulatively for the January to March period, a total of **1,294** Japanese visitors came to Jamaica. This was down from the **1,320** recorded for the corresponding period in 2005.

Other Countries

Of the other countries, Australia with **175** stopovers in March increased by **17.4%** against the **149** who came in 2005.

Market Share

The market share of stopover visitors for the first quarter January—March 2006 were as follows:

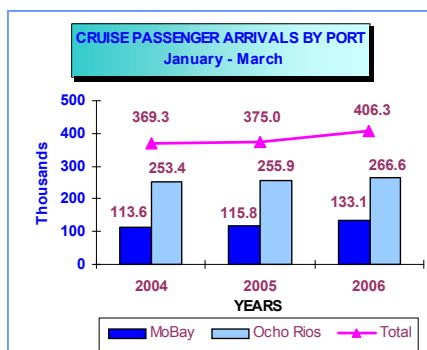
USA **70.4%**; Canada **12.2%**; UK **8.5%**; Continental Europe **5.1%**, the Caribbean **2.4%**; Latin America **0.6%**; Japan **0.3%** and Other Countries **0.4%**.

Cruise Passengers

A total of **153,972** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in March 2006. This represents a **2.1%** increase against the **150,871** recorded for March 2005.

Cumulatively, a total of **406,302** cruise passengers visited our shores in the January to March period, an increase of **8.4%** against the **374,973** recorded for the corresponding period in 2005.

A total of **99,773** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios in March, an increase of less than **1%** over the **99,635** recorded for March 2005.



For the January to March period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Ocho Rios was **266,586**, an increase of **4.2%** against the **255,929** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

Montego Bay recorded a total of **51,461** cruise passengers for the month, an increase of **3.2%** against the **49,843** recorded for 2005.

Cumulatively, for the January to March period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Montego Bay was **133,133**, an increase of **15%** against the **115,807** recorded for the same period in 2005.

Length of Stay

The average length of stay of **Foreign National** arrivals in March was the same **8.5** nights as in March 2005.

Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to March period was **9** nights, this is the same level recorded in 2005.

The average length of stay of **Non-Resident Jamaican** arrivals in March was **15.5** nights compared to the **18.4** nights in March 2005. Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to March period was **16.6** nights, compared to **19.8** nights in 2005.

Purpose of Visit

During period under review, January to March 2006, **83.7%** or **349,679** of the **417,770** Foreign Nationals who visited Jamaica were visiting for the purpose of Leisure, **5.8%** were on Business, **5.1%** were Visiting Friends & Relatives, and the remaining **5.4%** were on Other purposes of travel.

A total of **7,795** or **41.5%** of the **18,792** Non-Resident Jamaicans who travelled to Jamaica in this period January to March 2006 were visiting for Leisure, **23.9%** were visiting Friends & Relatives, **12.6%** were on Business and the remaining **22.0%** were on Other purposes of travel.

Intended Resort Area of Stay

Of the **436,562** stopover arrivals visiting Jamaica in during January and March 2006, the resort area of Montego Bay welcomed **128,554** arrivals or **29.4%**. Ocho Rios received **106,258** or **24.3%**, Negril got **100,293** or **23%**, and Kingston got **47,685** or **10.9%**. The remaining **12.3%** stayed in the Mandeville/Southcoast, Port Antonio resort regions and Other areas in Jamaica.

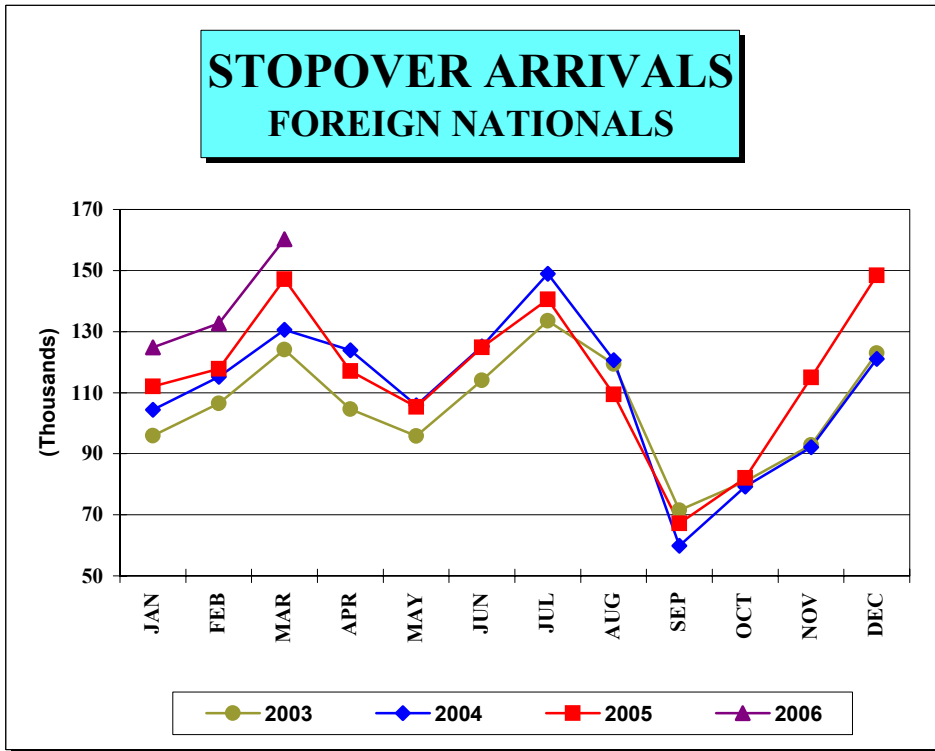

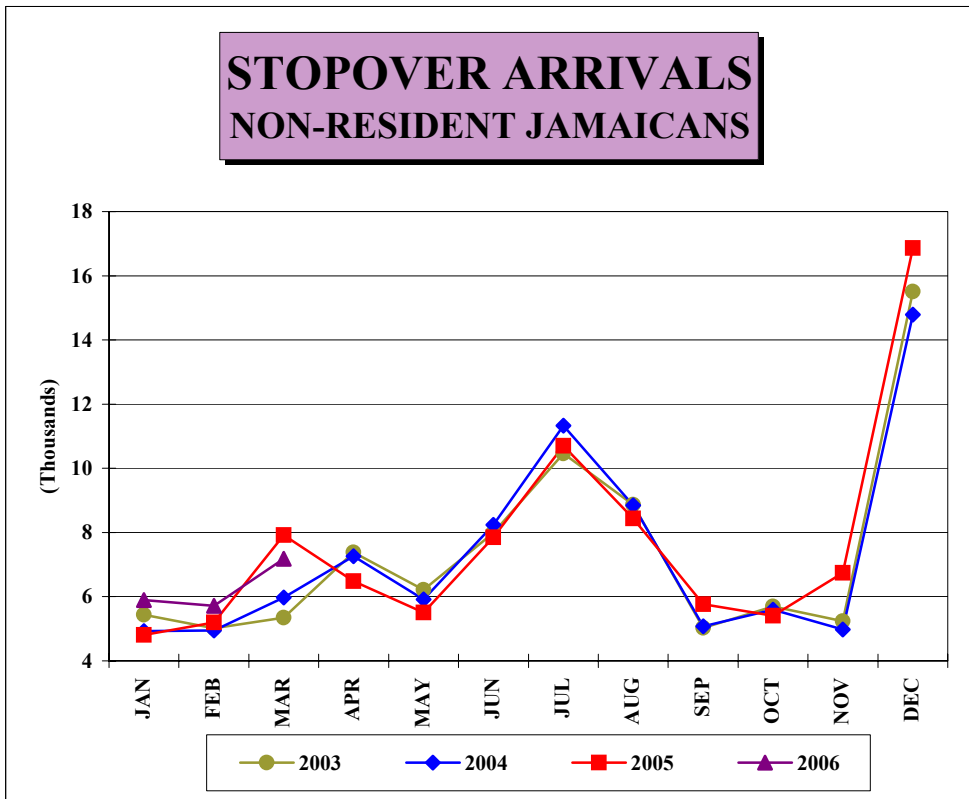

JAN - MAR. 2006**

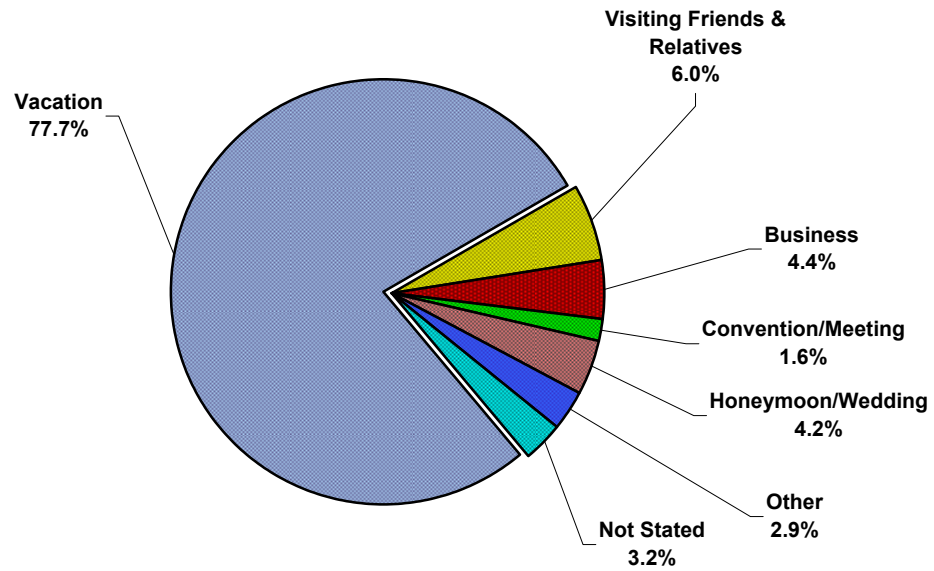

STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

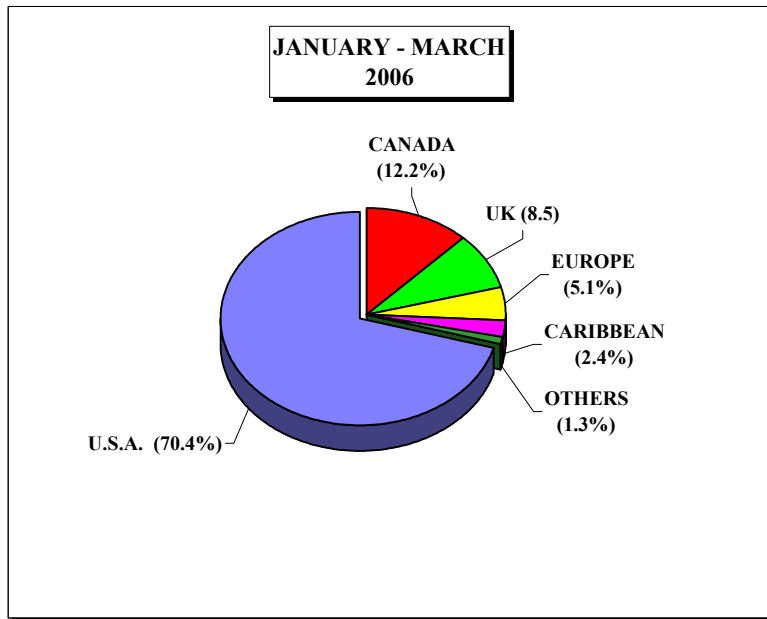

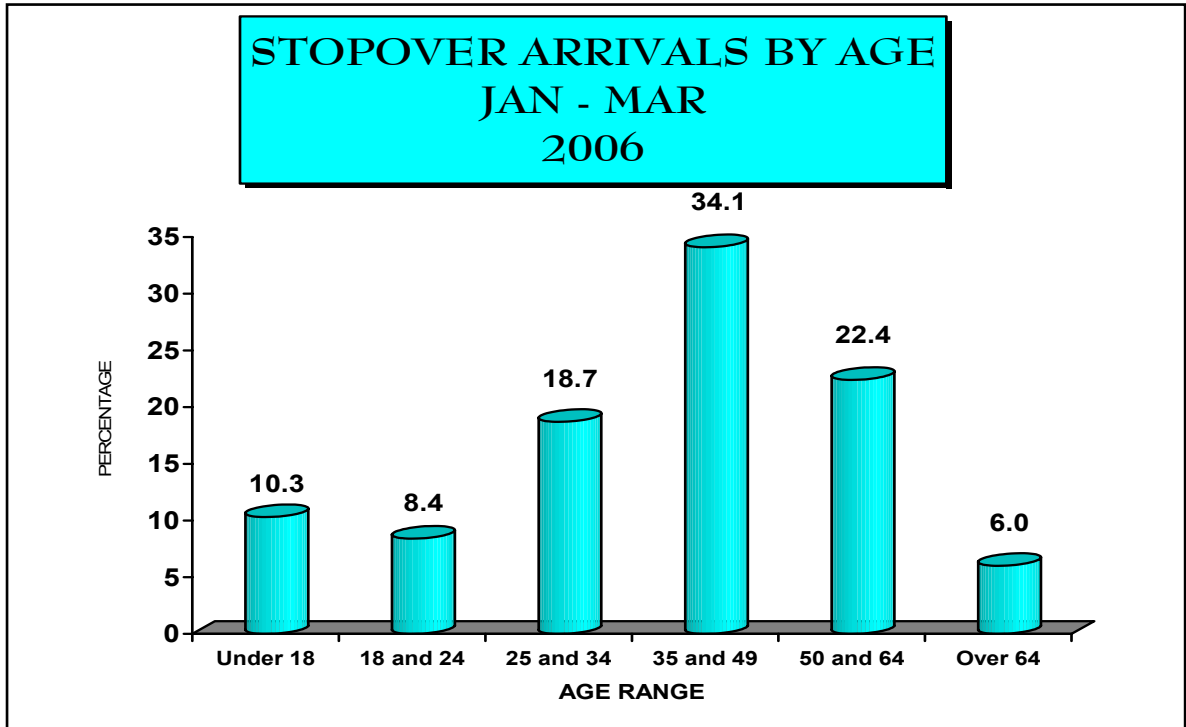

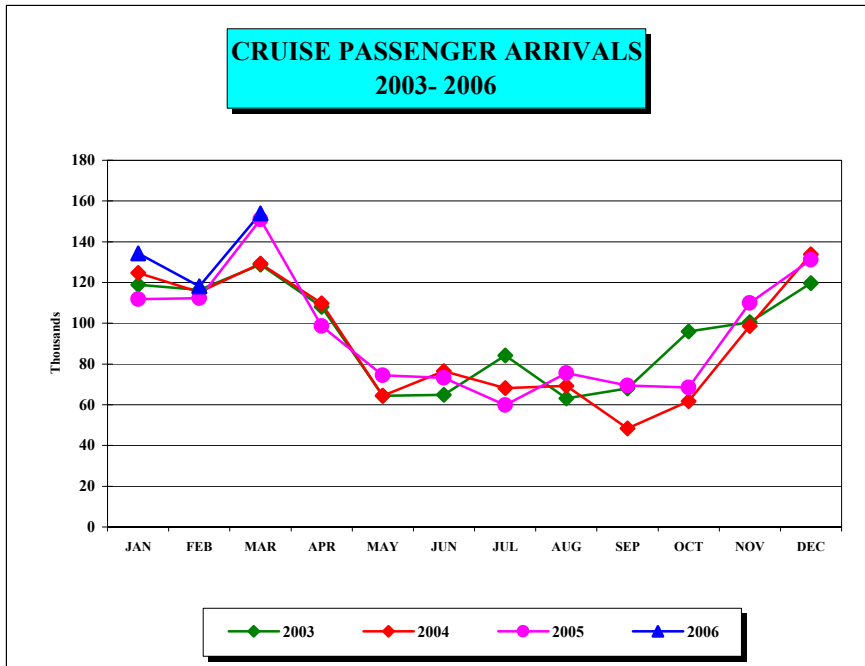

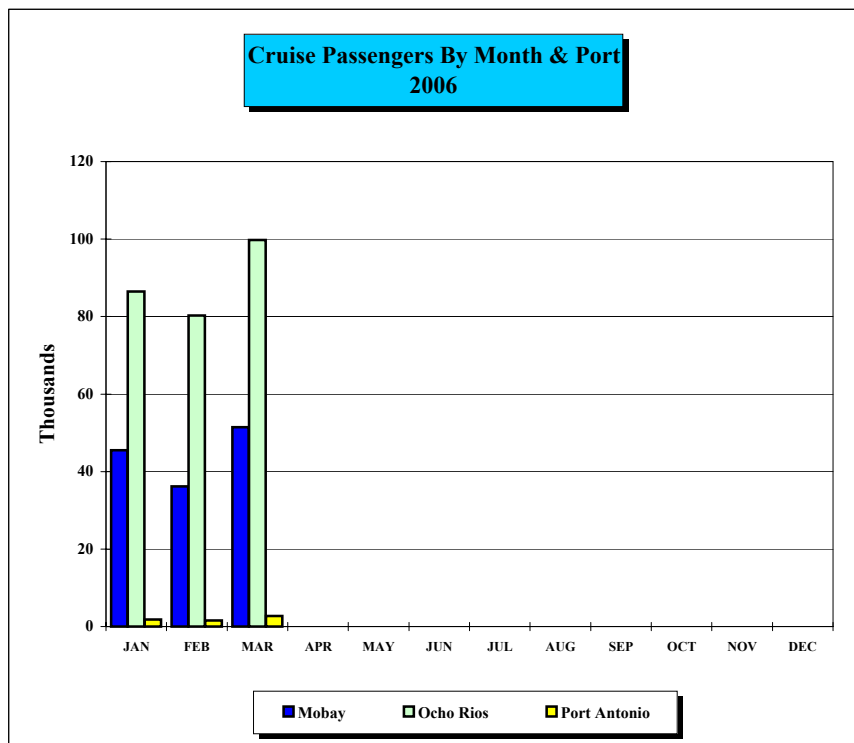

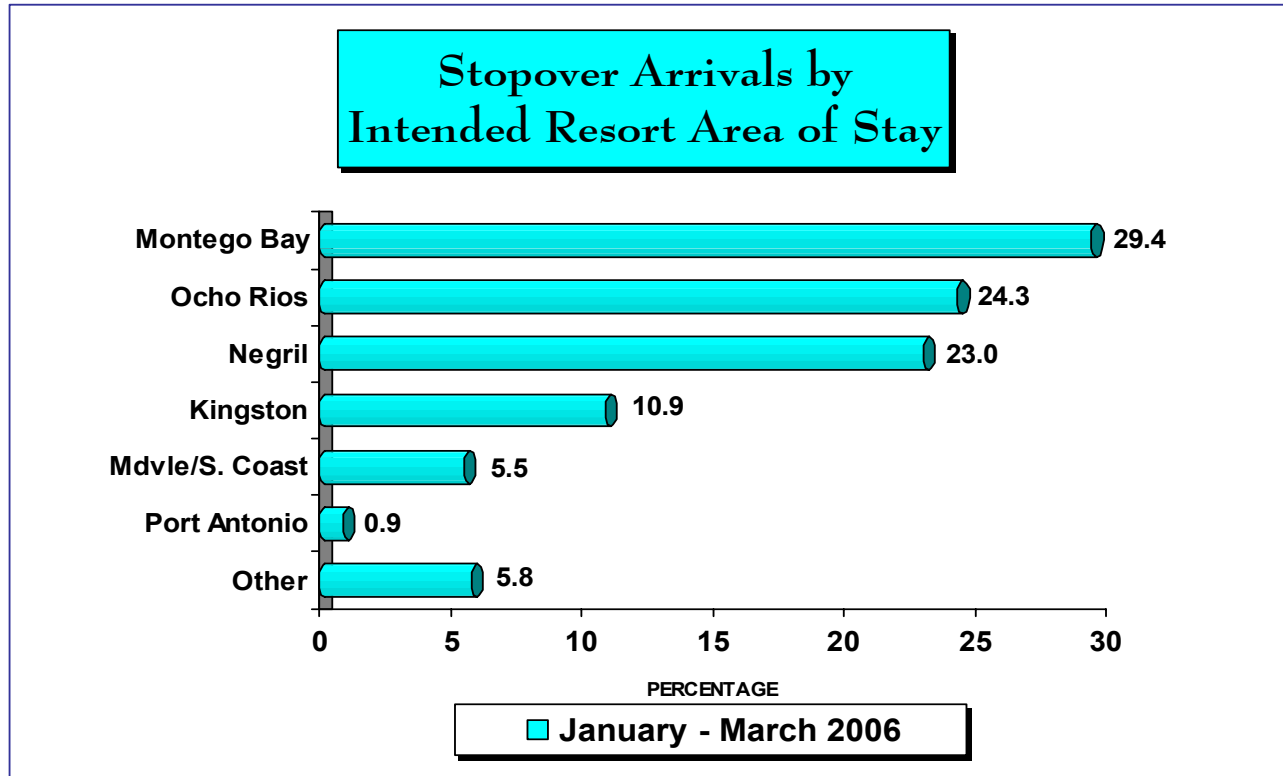
