

# JAMAICA

## TOURIST BOARD

### IN May 2005.....

- Stopover arrivals down by 1%
- US Market declined by 1%
- Canada decreased by 2%
- Europe declined by 3%
- Cruise Passenger arrivals up by 16%.

## TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in May 2005 were **110,821**, a decrease of less than **1%** over the **111,759** recorded for May 2004.

Cumulatively, stopover arrivals for the January to May, period grew by **3.4%** with **629,368**, compared to **608,945** in 2004.

### United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market declined by less than **1%** in May, with a total of **80,237** visitors compared to the **80,611** visitors who came in May 2004. The Northeast marketing region was the only area in the US to record a decrease in May. The Northeast declined by **3.2%**. While the Midwest increased by **3.5%**, the West by **2.5%** and the South increased by less than **1%**.

For the January to May period, the US market increased by approximately **3%**. Total visitors from that market was **446,469** compared to **433,832** for the corresponding period in 2004. Three of the four main marketing regions recorded growth. The Northeast increased by **2%**, the South was up by **9%** and the West was up by **6%**. The Midwest recorded a decline of **2%**.

### Canada

In May, the Canadian market declined by **2%** with a total of **6,752** stopovers compared to **6,859** in 2004. The leading province of Ontario decreased by **13%**, while the second most important visitor-producing province of

Quebec increased by **129%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market increased by **16%** in the January to May period with a total of **60,947** stopovers compared to **52,582** in 2004. The main provinces of Ontario and Quebec increased by **12%** and **42%** respectively. The other notable increases were Alberta **21%** and British Columbia **29%**.

### Europe

The European market recorded a decline of **5%** in May 2005. The market provided a total of **18,154** stopover visitors compared to the **19,103** recorded in May 2004. Of the primary marketing countries within the European market, the United Kingdom declined by **7%**, while Germany and Italy increased by **5%** and **17%** respectively. The other countries which showed notable increases were: France and the Netherlands, which recorded double-digit increases of **46%** and **41%** respectively.

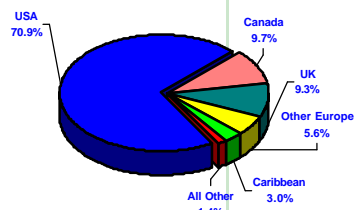
Cumulatively, for the January to May period, the European market declined by **2%**. Total stopovers for the period was **94,239** compared to **95,737** in 2004. The United Kingdom, with a total of **58,728** stopovers, declined by **7%**. The other two leading European countries, Italy with a total of **11,702** increased by **11%** and Germany with **8,864** stopovers, declined by less than **1%**.

### Latin America

The Latin American market decreased by **13%** in May with a total of **853** stopovers compared to **981** in May 2004.

For the January to May period, the Latin American market decreased by **9%** with a total of **4,176** visitors compared to **4,570** for the corresponding period in 2004.

## The Caribbean

Visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region increased by **23%** in May with a total of **3,966** visitors, compared to **3,233** in May 2004.

The major Caribbean countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in May were: the Cayman Islands (**1,286**), Trinidad and Tobago (**762**), Barbados (**486**), Bermuda (**227**), Antigua (**190**), the Bahamas (**186**), and Puerto Rico (**110**).

Cumulatively, the Caribbean stopovers arrivals to Jamaica in the January to May period increased by **8%**, moving from **17,369** in 2004 to **18,695** in 2005. The Cayman Islands is the leading provider of visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region. For the January to May period they provided a total of **6,189** visitors followed by Trinidad and Tobago with **3,163**, Barbados with **2,110** and the Bahamas with **954** visitors.

## Japan

The Japanese market increased by **9%** in May with a total of **329** stopovers compared to **303** in May 2004.

Cumulatively for the January to May period, a total of **2,037** Japanese visitors came to Jamaica. This was down **2%** from the **2,079** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

## Other Countries

Of the other countries, Australia, with **132** stopovers in May, de-

creased by less than **1%**, against the **133** who came in 2004.

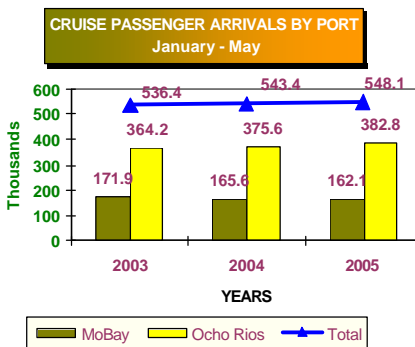
## Market Share

The market share of stopover visitors for the period January to May was as follows:

USA **70.9%**; Canada **9.7%**; UK **9.3%**; Continental Europe **5.6%**, the Caribbean **3%**; Latin America **0.7%**; Japan **0.3%** and Other Countries **0.4%**.

## Cruise Passengers

A total of **74,505** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in May 2005. This represents a **16%** increase over the **64,424** recorded for May 2004. Cumulatively, a total of **548,132** cruise passengers visited our shores during January to May, an increase of **1%** against the **543,435** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.



A total of **57,345** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios in May, an increase of **19%** over the **48,372** recorded for May 2004. For the January to May period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Ocho Rios was **382,772**, an increase of **2%** against the **375,577** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

Montego Bay recorded a total of **17,160** cruise passengers for the month, an increase of some **19%** against the **48,372** recorded for 2004. Cumulatively, for the January to May period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Montego Bay was **162,051**, a decrease of **2%** against the **165,583** recorded for the same period in 2004.

## Length of Stay

The average length of stay of stopovers in May was **8.9** nights against **8.7** nights recorded in May 2004. The average length of stay in hotels was **6.5** nights compared to **6.1** nights in May 2004.

Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to May period was approximately **9** nights same as that recorded for the similar period in 2004.

## Purpose of Visit

During the period under review January to May 2005, **82%** or **490,155** of the **599,460** Foreign Nationals who visited Jamaica were visiting for the purpose of Leisure, **6%** were on Business, another **6%** were Visiting Friends & Relatives, and the remaining **7%** were on Other purposes of travel.

A total of **11,869** or **40%** of the **29,908** Non-Resident Jamaicans who travelled to Jamaica during the period January to May 2005 were visiting for Leisure, **25%** were visiting Friends & Relatives, **9%** were on Business and the remaining **26%** were on Other purposes of travel.

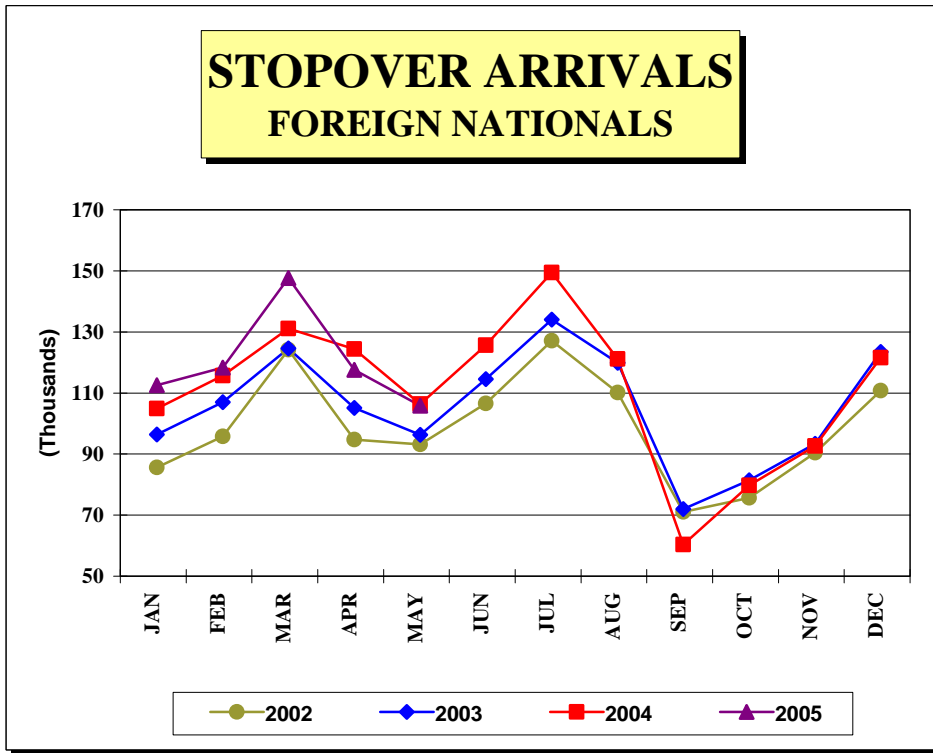

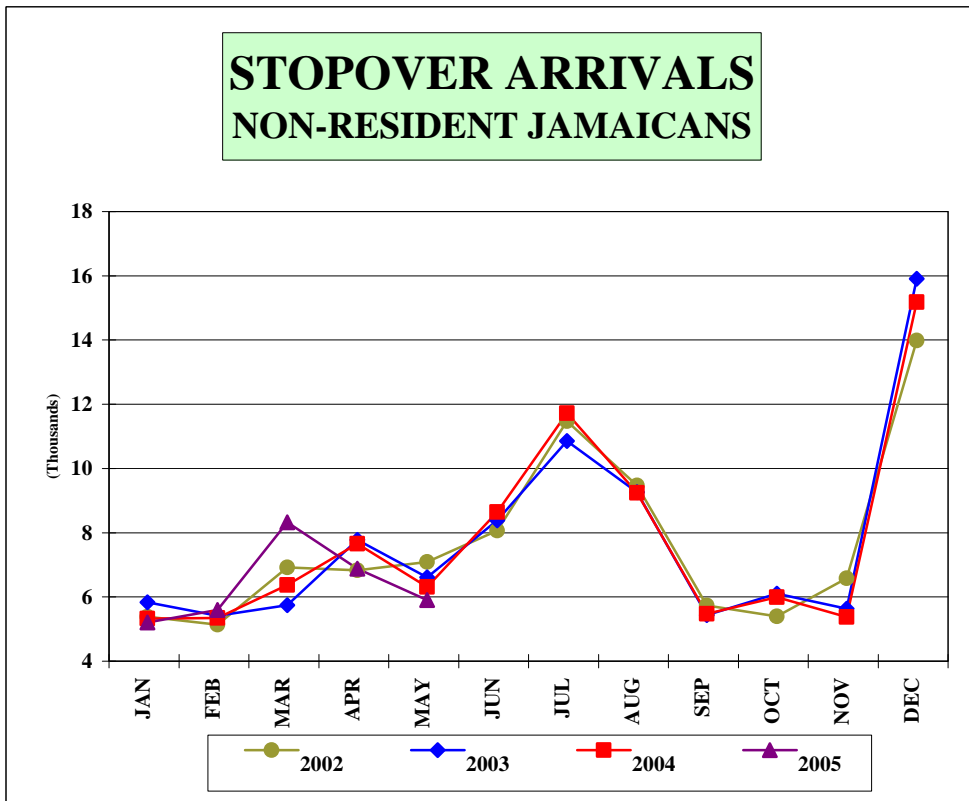
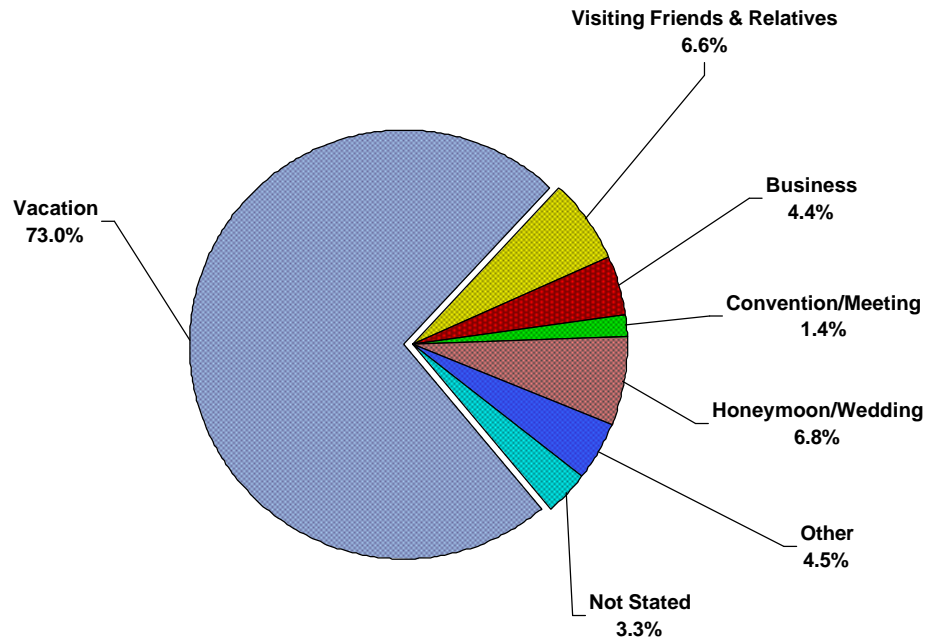

## STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

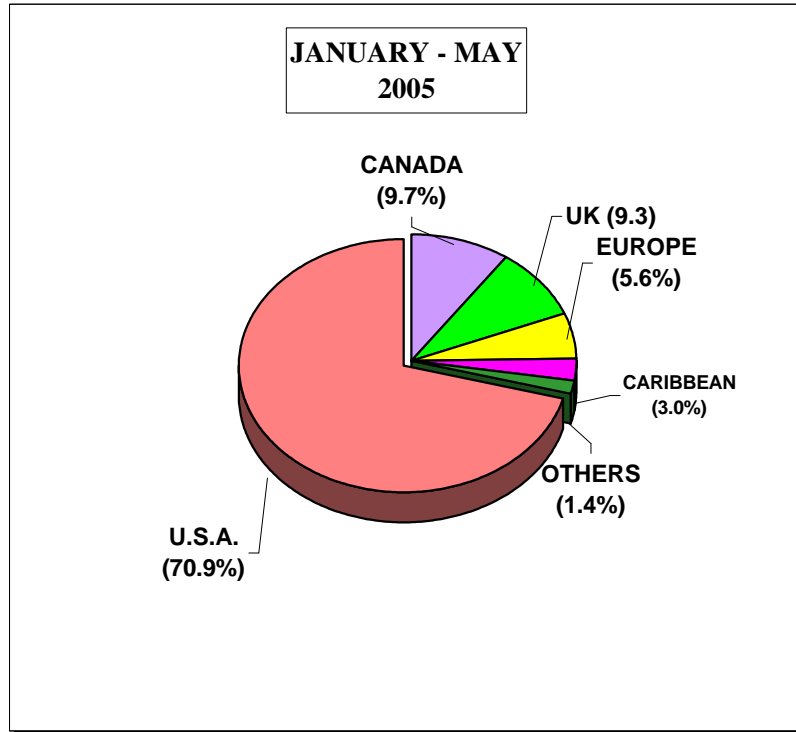

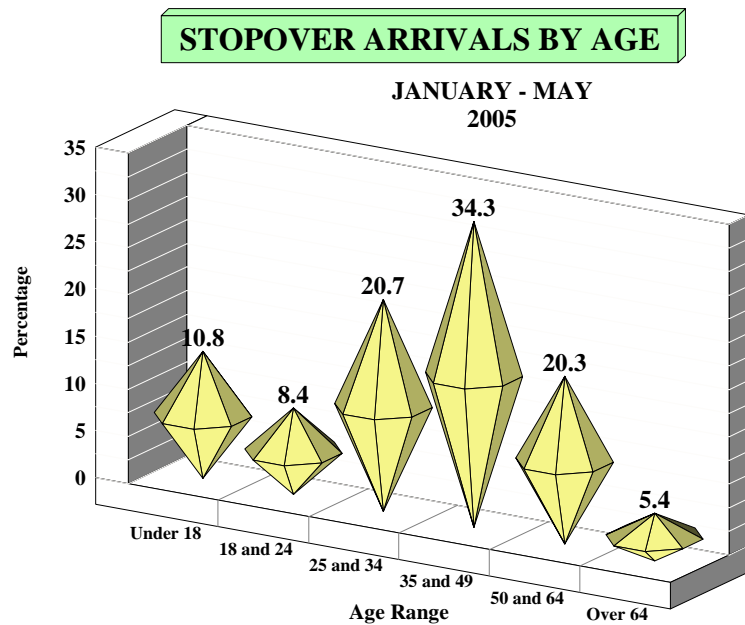

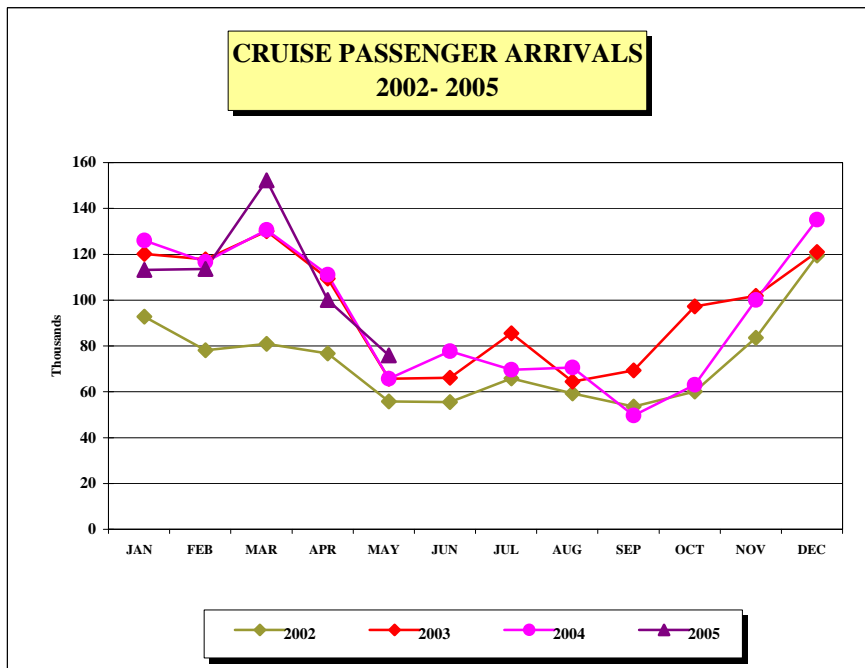

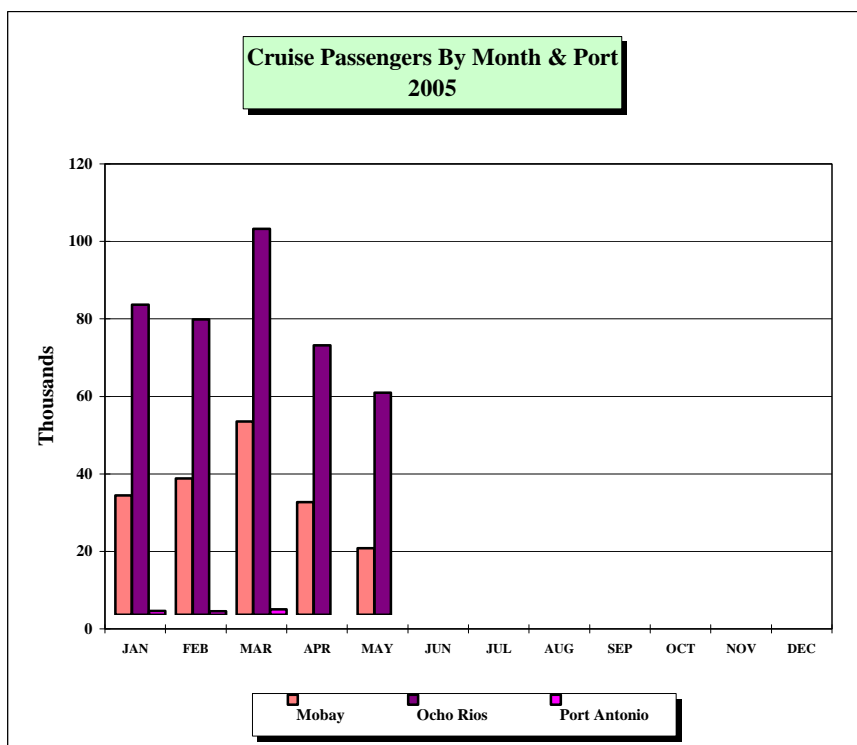

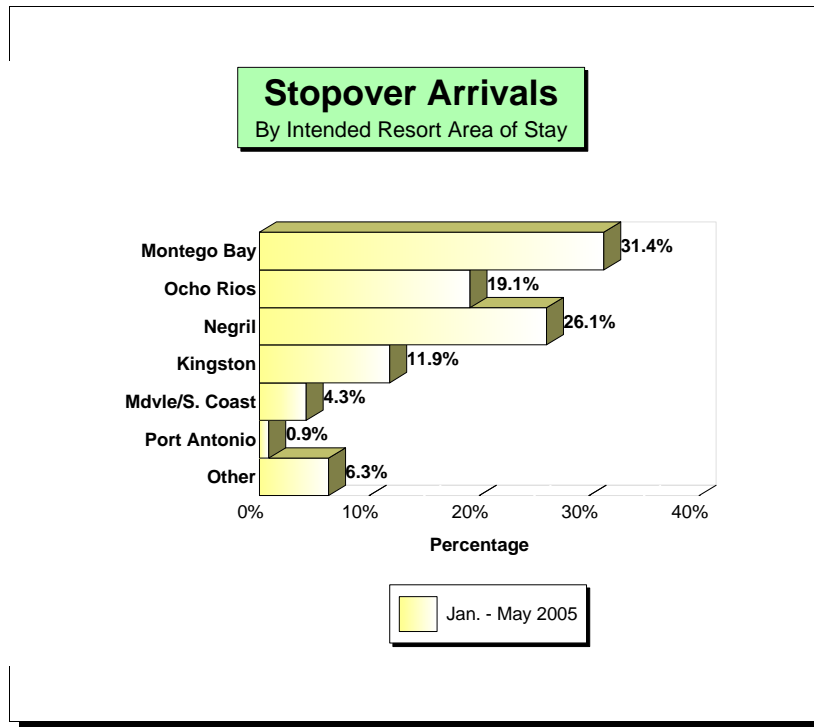
