

# JAMAICA

## TOURIST BOARD

### In October 2005.....

- Stopover arrivals up by 3.1%
- US Market up by 7.1%
- Canada down by 2.4%
- Europe down by 4.6%
- Cruise Passengers increased by 11%.

## TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in October 2005 were **87,467** an increase of **3.1%** over the **84,802** recorded for October 2004. To date, for the six months of summer, May to October 2005, stopover arrivals decreased by **1.7%**, with a total of **673,111** compared to **684,651** for the same period in 2004.

Cumulatively, stopover arrivals for the January to October period were slightly up by **0.8%** with **1,191,658**, compared to **1,181,837** in 2004.

### United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market increased by **7.1%** in October, with a total of **59,235** visitors compared to the **55,292** visitors who came in October 2004. All the marketing regions recorded increases. The Midwest was up by **17.3%**, the West up by **10.4%**, the South up by **5.9%**, and the Northeast up **3.5%**.

For the summer period to date, May to October, the US market recorded a decrease by less than **1%**, with the exception of the Northeast, which declined by **5.5%**. The South was up by **3.9%**, the Midwest up by **5%**, and the West up by **5.7%**.

For the January to October period, the US market increased by **1.5%**. Total visitors from that market was **854,236** compared to **841,282** for the corresponding period in 2004. The Northeast decreased by **1.9%**, and the Midwest was up by less than **1%**. The South was up by **6.7%**, and the West up by **6.2%**.

### Canada

In October, the Canadian market decreased by **2.4%** with a total of **5,044** stopovers compared to **5,147** in 2004. The leading province of Ontario decreased by **6.6%**, and the second most important visitor-producing province of Quebec decreased by **5.2%**.

For the summer period, May to October, a total of **36,207** stopovers came from this market compared to **37,267** in 2004, a decrease of **2.8%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market increased by **8.9%** in the January to October period with a total of **90,402** stopovers compared to **82,990** in 2004. The main provinces of Ontario and Quebec increased by **3.3%** and **44.4%** respectively. The other notable increases were Alberta **16.3%** and British Columbia **24.6%**.

### Europe

The European market recorded a decrease of **4.6%** in October 2005. The market provided a total of **18,303** stopover visitors compared to the **19,185** recorded in October 2004. Of the primary marketing countries within the European market, the United Kingdom and Italy declined by **0.3%**, and **35.7%**, respectively, while Germany increased by **0.7%**.

During the summer period, May to October, the European market declined by **7.2%** with **113,927** visitors compared to **122,711** visitors who came in the same period of 2004.

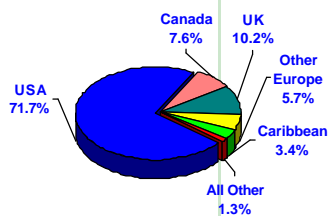
Cumulatively, for the January to October period, the European market declined by **4.7%**. Total stopovers for the period was **190,012** compared to **199,345** in 2004. The United Kingdom, with a total of **121,542** stopovers, declined by **9.0%**. The other two leading European countries, Italy with a total of **20,534** decreased by **2.9%**, and Germany with **15,052** stopovers, increased by **6.9%**. The other countries which recorded notable increases were: Portugal (**136.2%**), Netherlands (**56%**), France (**25.5%**), and Belgium (**10.9%**).

### Latin America

The Latin American market declined by **3.9%** in October with a total of **689** stopovers compared to **717** in October 2004. The Central American region declined by **19.2%**, with **358** stopovers compared to **443** in October 2004. The South American countries combined increased by **20.8%** with **331** stopovers compared to **274** in October 2004.

For the January to October period, the Latin American market has declined by **5.2%** with a total of **7,021** visitors compared to **7,403** for the corresponding period in 2004.

## The Caribbean

Visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region declined by **7%** in October with a total of **3,408** visitors, compared to **3,665** in October 2004.

The major Caribbean countries which provided visitors to Jamaica in October were: the Cayman Islands (**1,056**), Trinidad and Tobago (**558**), Barbados (**423**), Guyana (**160**), the Bahamas (**147**), Puerto Rico (**125**), Curacao (**124**), and Antigua (**121**).

Cumulatively, the Caribbean stopovers arrivals to Jamaica in the January to October period decreased by **1.4%**, moving from **41,582** in 2004 to **41,016** in 2005. The Cayman Islands is the leading provider of visitors to Jamaica from the Caribbean region. For the January to October period, they provided a total of **12,924** visitors followed by Trinidad and Tobago with **6,416**, Barbados with **4,309** and the Bahamas with **2,244** visitors.

## Japan

The Japanese market declined by **29.3%** in October with a total of **195** stopovers compared to **276** in October 2004.

Cumulatively for the January to October period, a total of **3,485** Japanese visitors came to Jamaica. This was down **4.8%** from the **3,660** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

## Other Countries

Of the other countries, Australia, with **136** stopovers in October, decreased by **12.8%**, against the **156** who came in 2004.

## Market Share

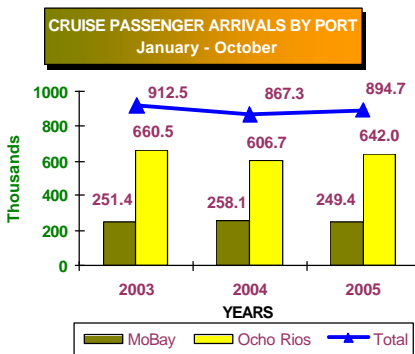
The market share of stopover visitors for the period January to October was as follows:

USA **71.7%**; UK **10.2%**; Canada **7.6%**; Continental Europe **5.7%**, the Caribbean **3.4%**; Latin America **0.6%**; Japan **0.3%** and Other Countries **0.5%**.

## Cruise Passengers

A total of **68,463** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in October 2005. This represents a **10.9%** increase over the **61,723** recorded for October 2004.

During the six months of summer, May to October, cruise passenger arrivals increased by **8.4%** with **421,113** compared to the **388,307** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.



Cumulatively, a total of **894,740** cruise passengers visited our shores during January to October, an increase of **3.2%** against the **867,318** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

A total of **50,734** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios in October, an increase of over **5.1%** over the **48,258** recorded for October 2004.

For the summer period to date, May to October, a total of **316,601** cruise passengers visited the port of Ocho Rios, up **13.3%** over the **279,516** recorded during the same period in 2004.

Cumulatively, for the January to October period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Ocho Rios was **642,028** an increase of **5.8%** against the **606,721** recorded for the corresponding period in 2004.

Montego Bay recorded a total of **17,729** cruise passengers for the month, an increase of some **33.7%** against the **13,260** recorded for 2004.

For the summer period to date, May to October, a total of **104,512** cruise passengers visited the port of Montego Bay, down by **3.8%** over the **108,586** recorded during the same period in 2004.

Cumulatively, for the January to October period, cruise passenger arrivals to the port of Montego Bay was **249,403**, a decrease of **3.4%** against the **258,117** recorded for the same period in 2004.

## Length of Stay

The average length of stay of stopovers in October was **9.8** nights, against **9.9** for October 2004. The average length of stay in hotels was **7** nights compared to **6.4** nights in October 2004.

Cumulatively, the average length of stay for the January to October period was **9.7** nights, against **9.6** nights that was recorded for the similar period in 2004.

## Purpose of Visit

During the period under review January to October 2005, **81%** or **905,729** of the **1,123,595** Foreign Nationals who visited Jamaica were visiting for the purpose of Leisure, **6%** were on Business, another **6%** were Visiting Friends & Relatives, and the remaining **7%** were on Other purposes of travel.

A total of **29,707** or **44%** of the **68,063** Non-Resident Jamaicans who travelled to Jamaica during the period January to October 2005 were visiting for Leisure, **23%** were visiting Friends & Relatives, **9%** were on Business and the remaining **24%** were on Other purposes of travel.

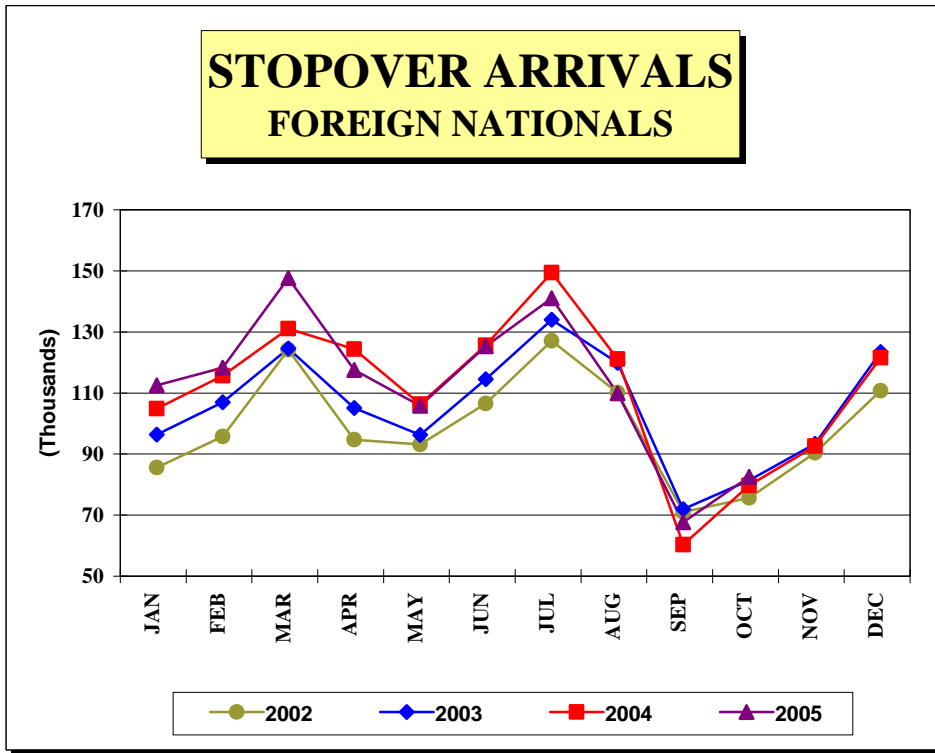

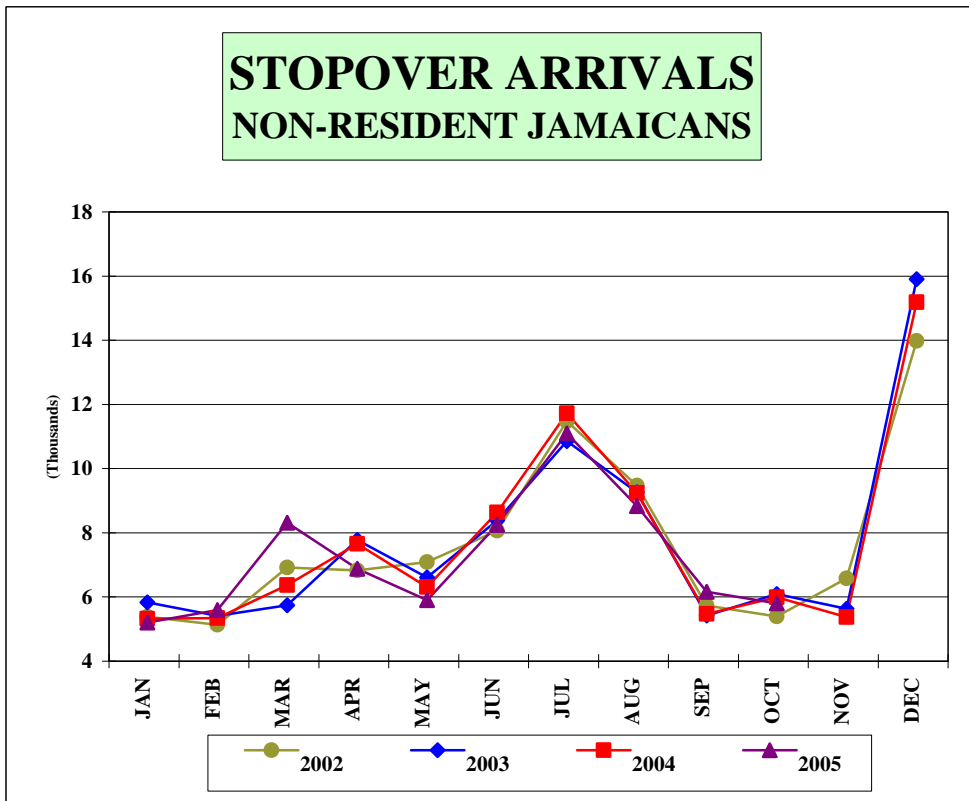
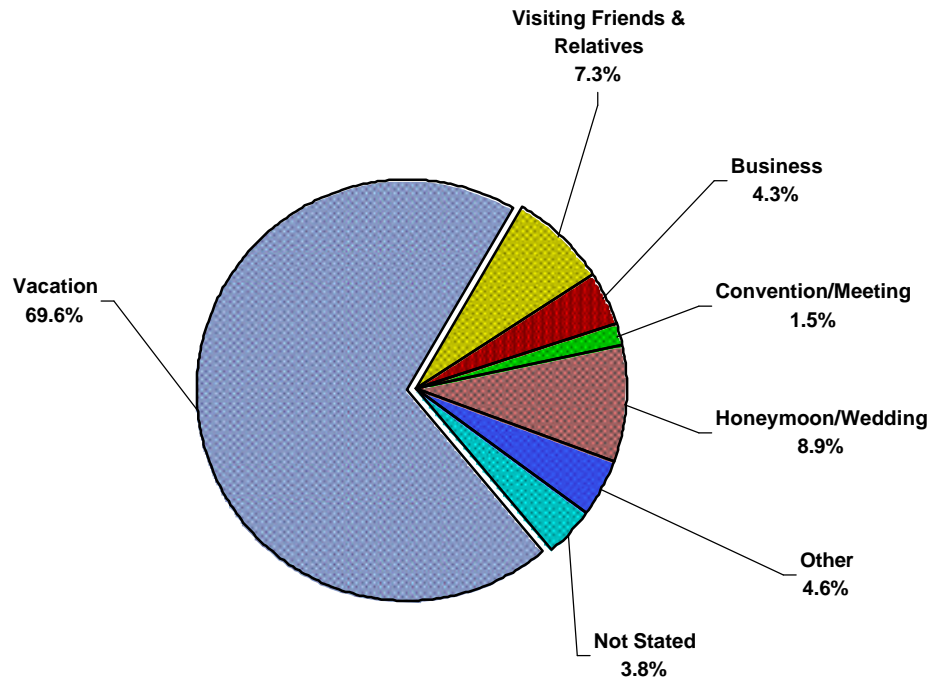

## STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

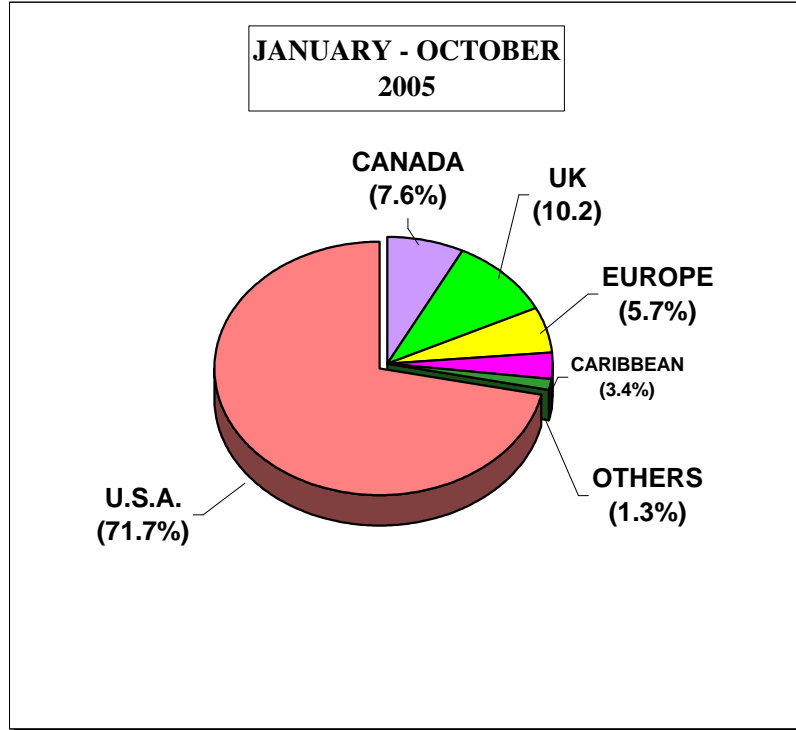

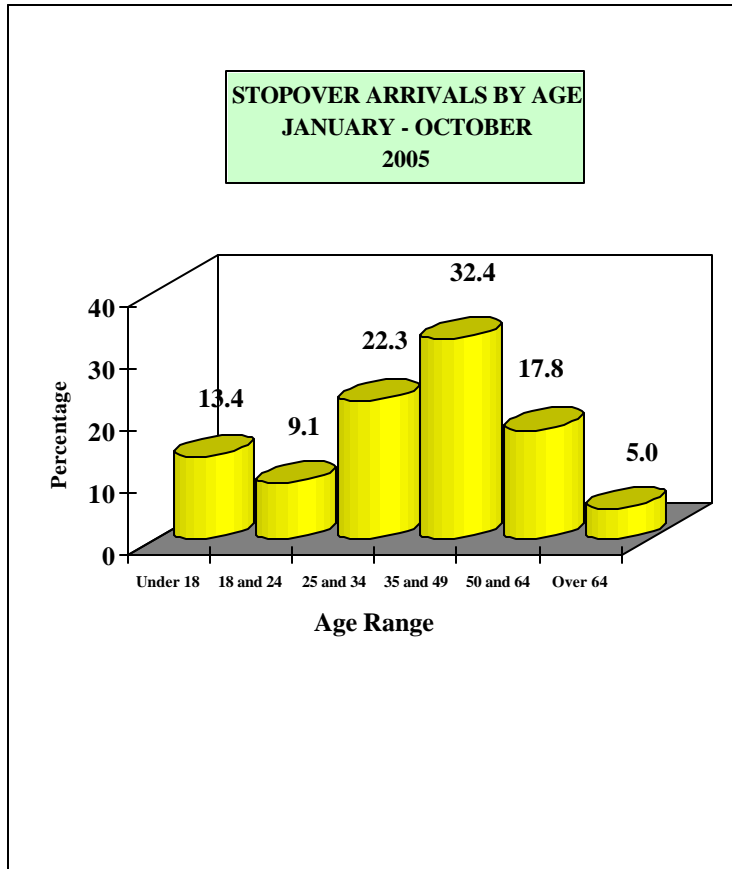

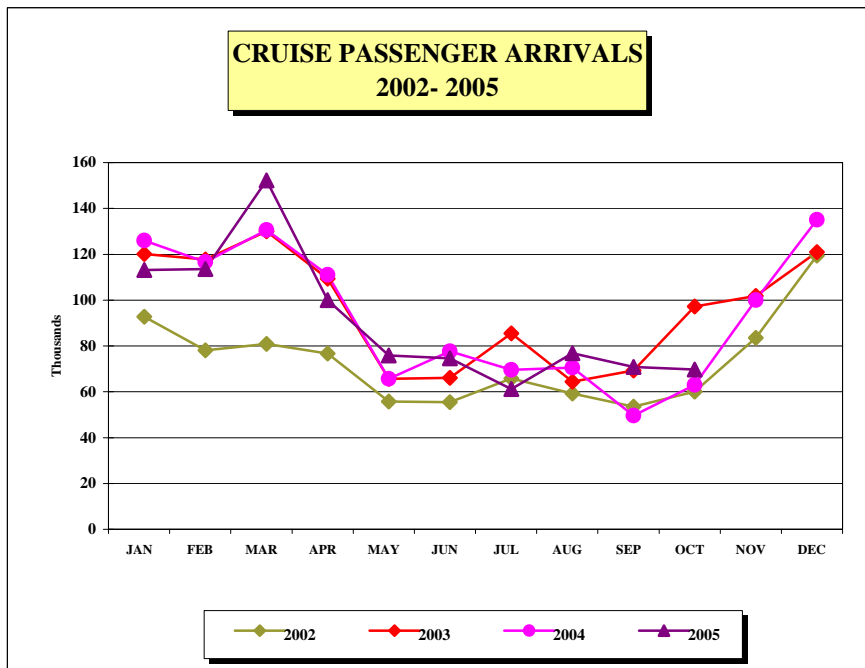

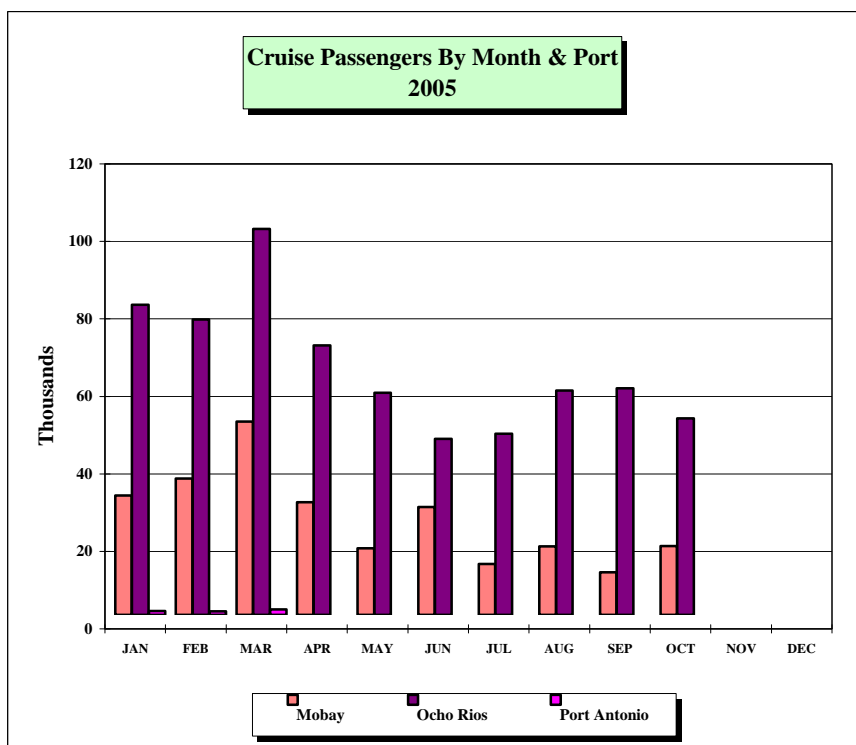

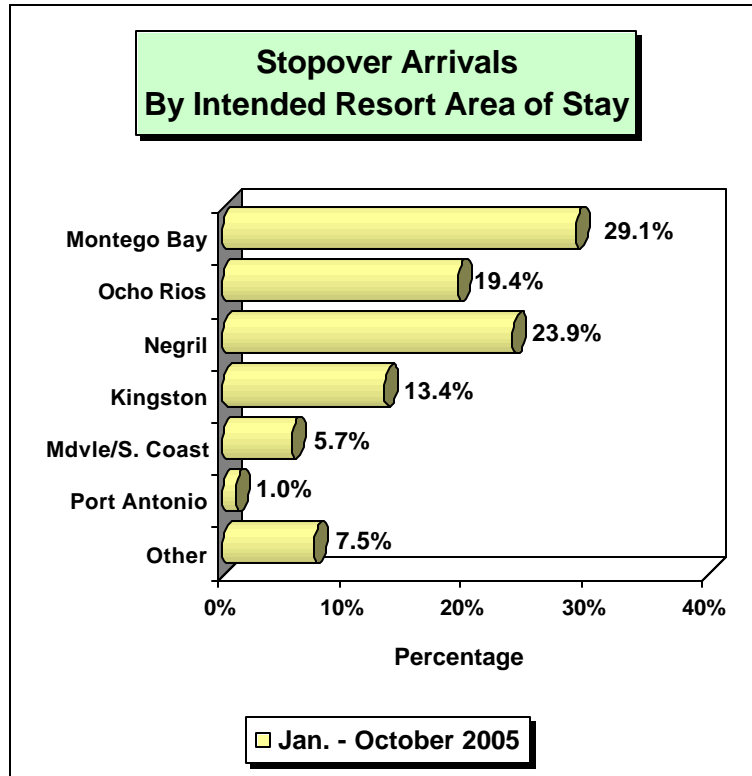
