

# JAMAICA TOURIST BOARD

**IN APRIL 2018...**

- Stopover arrivals down 0.5%
- US Market down 1.8%
- Canada up 2.6%
- Europe up 3.0%
- Cruise Passenger down by 1.8%

## TOURIST (Stopover Arrivals)

Stopover arrivals in April 2018 were **204,734**, a decrease of **0.5%** over the **205,822** recorded in April 2017 and a 8.6% increase over the 188,604 in 2016.

For the January to April period, arrivals increased by **4.9%**, with **829,736** stopovers compared to **790,965** in 2017.

### United States

Stopover arrivals from the United States market recorded a decline of **1.8%** in April 2018, with a total of **130,210** arrivals compared to the **132,638** arrivals who visited in April 2017. All the US marketing regions with the exception of the West recorded decreases in arrivals, the Northeast with **59,488** fell by **4.8%**, the South with **32,869** fell by **0.1%**, the Mid-West with **23,189** fell by **0.5%**, while the West with **14,664** grew by **5.4%**.

For the January to April period, the US market region has grown by **7.4%**, with **510,602** visitors, which is **35,130** more visitors compared to the **475,472** visitors that arrived in 2017 and **39,031** or **8.3%** more than the **471,571** in 2016. The Northeast has grown by **6.2%**, the Midwest up by **8.2%**, the South up by **8.6%**, and the West up by **7.6%**.

### Canada

In April 2018, the Canadian market recorded an increase in arrivals of **2.6%**, with **39,473** stopovers compared to **38,469** in April 2017.

Stopover arrivals from Atlantic Canada grew by **7.0%**; the main provinces of Nova Scotia increased by **8.1%**, over April 2017 and those from New Brunswick increased by **36.1%**.

Stopover arrivals from Central Canada increased by **3.2%**; the leading province of Ontario decreased by **0.6%**, while the second most important Canadian province of Quebec grew by **27.8%**.

Stopover arrivals from Western Canada fell by **5.8%**; the main province of Alberta recorded a decline of **8.2%**, while the arrivals from British Columbia increased by **18.3%**.

Cumulatively, the Canadian market with **172,052** is at the same level **0.0%** as it was in 2017 with **172,077**. The top producing provinces of Ontario with **115,817** rose by **1.4%**, while Quebec, with **21,379** visitors rose by **9.5%**.

### Europe

The European market region recorded an increase of **3.0%** in April 2018, with **25,483** stopover arrivals compared to the **24,741** recorded in April 2017.

In the Northern European region, the main visitor producing countries, United Kingdom, with **17,085** arrivals, fell by **0.9%**.

In the South-Western European region, Germany with **2,902** visitor arrivals increased by **24.2%**, Italy with **1,236** fell by **4.6%**, France with **980** arrivals increased by **29.8%** and the Netherlands with **934** grew by **55.4%**.

Stopover arrivals from Central-East Europe with **534** arrivals grew by **28.4%**.

For the January to April 2018 period, arrivals from the European market region grew by **1.7%**. Total stopover arrivals were **110,601** compared to **108,759** in 2017. Northern Europe fell by **6.5%**, moving down from **77,112** in 2017 to **72,134** in 2018. Arrivals from the South/West region grew by **18.8%** with **32,621** arrivals, and those from the Central/East region increased by a notable **39.6%** with **5,846** arrivals.

### Latin America

Arrivals from Latin America increased by remarkable **2.0%** in April 2018, with a total of **2,729** stopovers compared to **2,675** in April 2017.

From the Central American region, stopover arrivals fell by **0.7%** with **797** arrivals. Mexico with **340** arrivals rose by **2.7%**, and Panama with **184** rose by **7.6%**.

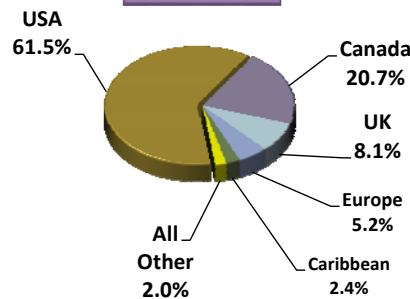
From the South American region, stopover arrivals increased by **3.2%** with **1,932** arrivals. Argentina with **574** arrivals grew by **33.8%**, Brazil with **519** arrivals increased by **35.9%**, while Chile with **325** decreased by **26.8%**.

Cumulatively, January to April 2018, stopover arrivals from Latin America increased by **11.9%**, with a total of **11,792** arrivals compared to **10,540** in 2017.

Stopovers from Central America grew by **2.5%**. The main producing countries of Mexico declined by **8.0%** and Panama increased by **6.2%**.

Stopover from South America increased by **15.2%** with **8,937** arrivals. The top producing countries of Argentina with **2,731** grew by **27.1%**, Brazil with **2,323** grew by **43.6%**, while Chile with **1,722** fell by **13.5%**.

## The Caribbean

Stopover arrivals to Jamaica from the Caribbean region were down **5.7%** in April 2018 with a total of **5,672** visitors, compared to **6,013** in April 2017.

The Cayman Islands and Trinidad & Tobago continued to be the major visitor producing Caribbean countries in April 2018 with **1,510** and **1,216** stopover arrivals, respectively.

Year to date, stopovers for the January - April period grew by **6.9%** moving up from **18,725** in 2017 to **20,008** in 2018

## Asia

The Asian market fell by **20.6%** in April 2018 with a total of **616** stopovers compared to **776** in April 2017.

China, Japan, and India, are the major visitor-producing countries with **259**, **145** and **106** stopovers arriving from each country, respectively.

For the January - April 2018 period, stopover arrivals from Asia fell by **24.5%**, with **2,632** arrivals compared to **3,484** arrivals in 2017.

## Other Countries

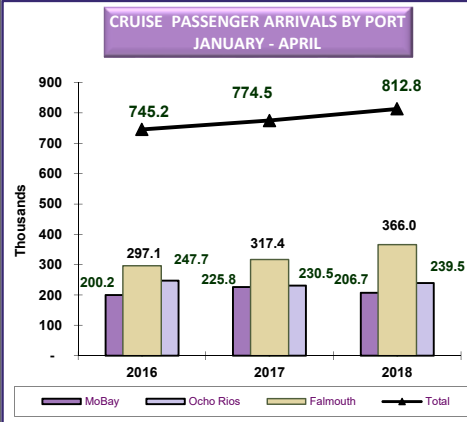
Overall, stopover arrivals from other countries increased by **7.4%** with **2,049** arrivals, for the January - April 2018 period. Of the Other Countries, Australia provided the most stop-over arrivals to Jamaica, with **747** visitors in 2018 compared to **809** in 2017. This represents a decrease of **7.7%**.

## Market Share

The market share of stopover visitors for January to April 2018 was as follows: USA **61.5%**; Canada **20.7%**; UK **8.1%**; Continental Europe **5.2%**, the Caribbean **2.4%**; and the others, including Latin America and Asia **2.0%**.

## Cruise Passengers

A total of **139,282** cruise passengers visited Jamaica in April 2018. This represented a **1.8%** decrease over the **141,792** who visited in April 2017.



For April 2018, Cruise passengers visiting the port of Falmouth grew by **4.0%** with **74,712** passengers. Those visiting the port of Montego Bay fell by **36.7%** with **23,487** passengers and Ocho Rios rose by **25.0%** with **41,083** passengers.

## Length of Stay

The average length of stay of **Foreign National** arrivals in April 2018 was **7.2** nights, compared to **7.9** nights in April 2017. The average length of stay in hotels was **6.0** nights in April 2018, compared to **6.6** nights in April 2017.

The average length of stay of **Non-Resident Jamaican** arrivals in April 2018 was **14.5** nights compared to **14.3** in April 2017. The average length of stay in hotels in April 2018 was **7.3** nights, compared to **7.6** nights in April 2017.

Year to date, January to April 2018, the average length of stay for Foreign Nationals in all types of accommodation was **7.8** nights compared to **8.2** nights during the same period in 2017. For the Non-Resident Jamaican arrivals the average length of stay was **15.7** nights compared to **15.0** nights in 2017.

## Purpose of Visit

During the month of April 2018, **91.0%** or **174,621** of the **191,939 Foreign Nationals** visited Jamaica for Leisure, **4.7%** were on Business, **3.9%** were on Other purposes of travel and **0.4%** did not state their purpose of travel.

A total of **9,932** or **77.6%** of the **12,795 Non-Resident Jamaicans** were visiting for Leisure, **4.1%** were on Business, **15.6%** were on Other purposes of travel and **2.6%** failed to provide a reason for travel.

Year to date January to April 2018, **90.7%** or a total of **752,765** of the total stopover arrivals of **829,736** visited Jamaica for Leisure, **4.0%** were on Business, **4.7%** were on Other purposes of travel and **0.6%** did not state their purpose of travel.

## Intended Resort Area of Stay

Of the **204,734** stopover arrivals visiting Jamaica in April 2018, the resort area of Montego Bay welcomed **73,267** arrivals or **35.8%**; Ocho Rios received **48,800** or **23.8%**, Negril welcomed **37,817** or **18.5%**; and **21,385** or **10.4%** visited Kingston. The remaining **11.5%** stayed in the Mandeville/South Coast, Port Antonio resort regions and Other areas in Jamaica.

Between January and April 2018, the distribution remain the same and the combination of Montego Bay, Negril, and Ocho Rios accounted for **655,008** or **78.9%** of the stopover arrivals.

## Type of Airlines used

Of the **829,736** stopover visitors to Jamaica in the period of January to April 2018, **767,503** or **92.5%** used scheduled airlines, while **62,233** or **7.5%** used chartered flights.

During the corresponding period in 2017 the percentage distribution was: **92.2%** - used scheduled airlines and **7.8%** - used chartered flights.

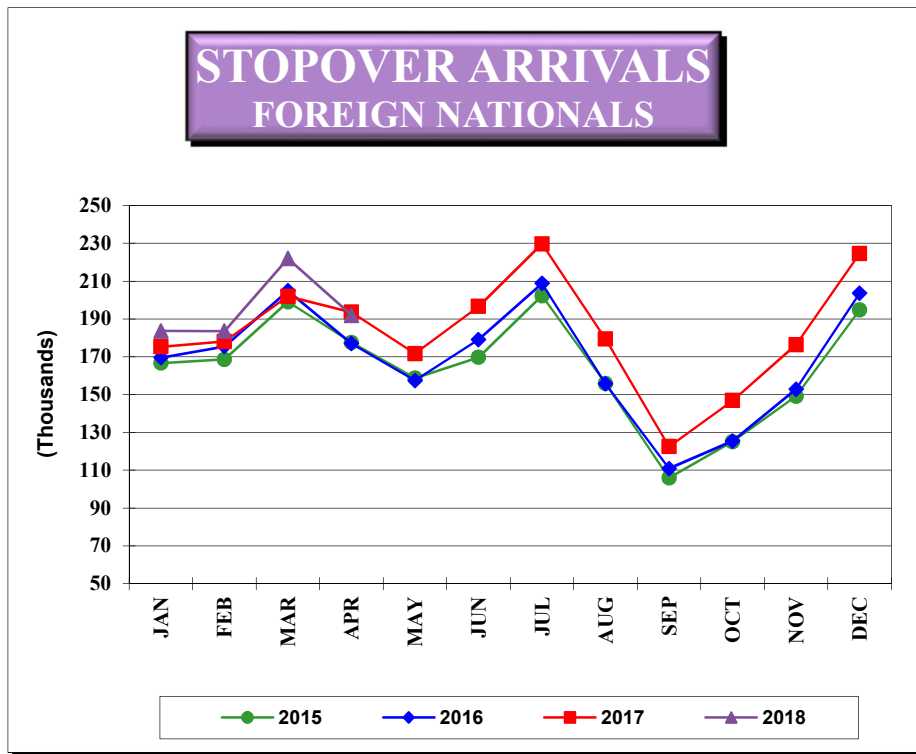

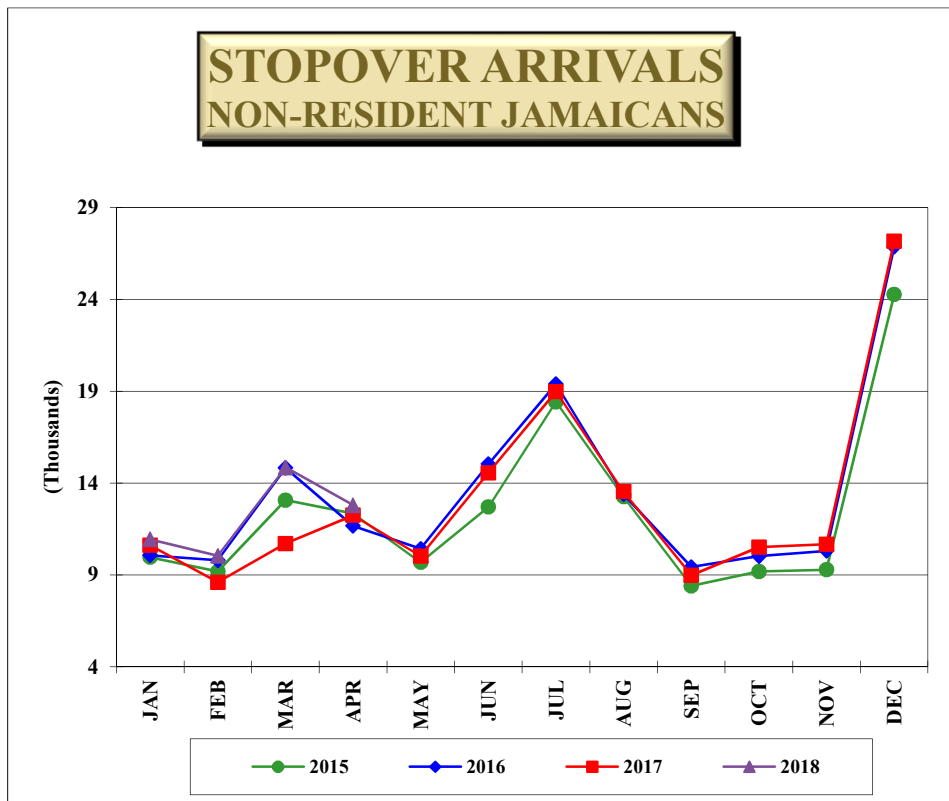
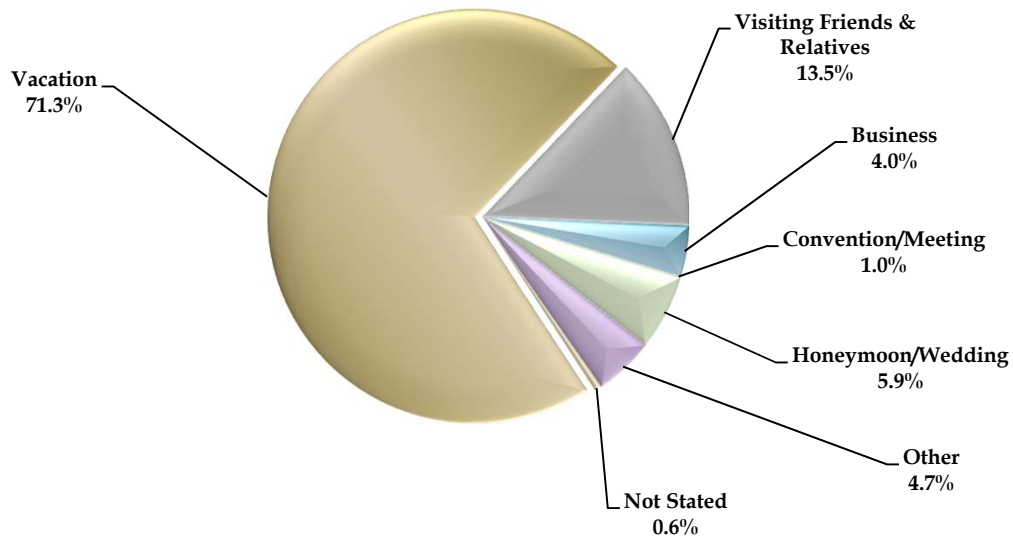

## STOPOVER VISITORS BY MARKET SHARE

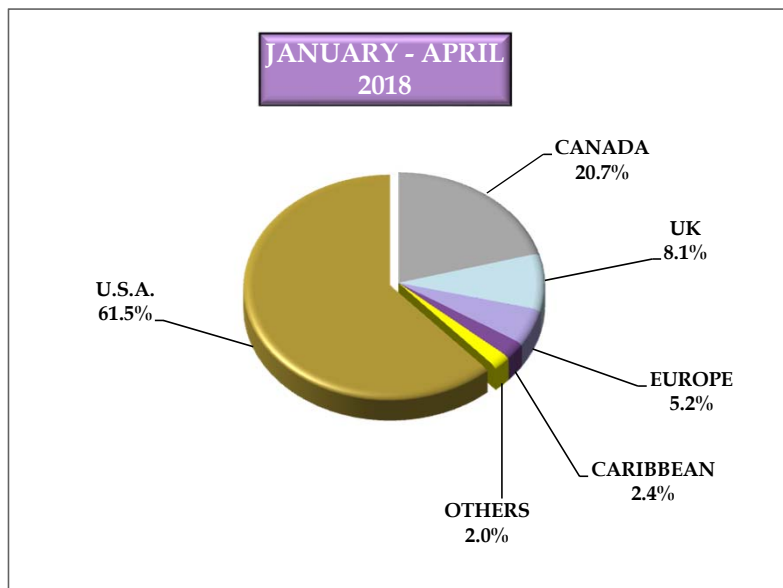

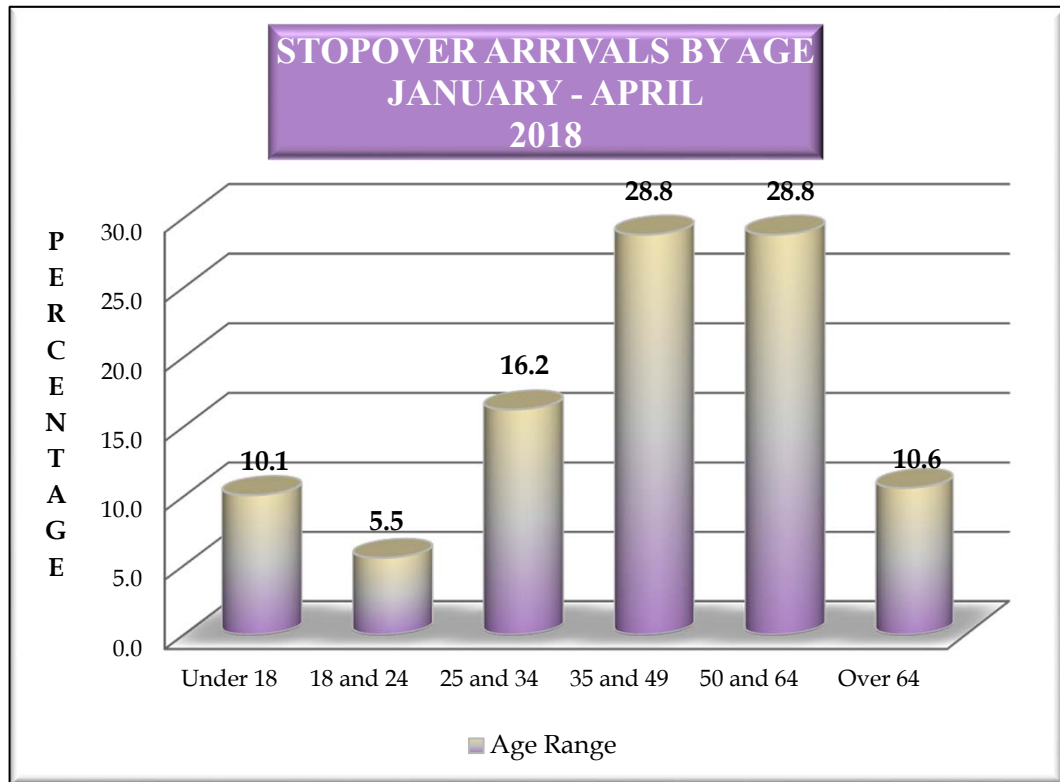

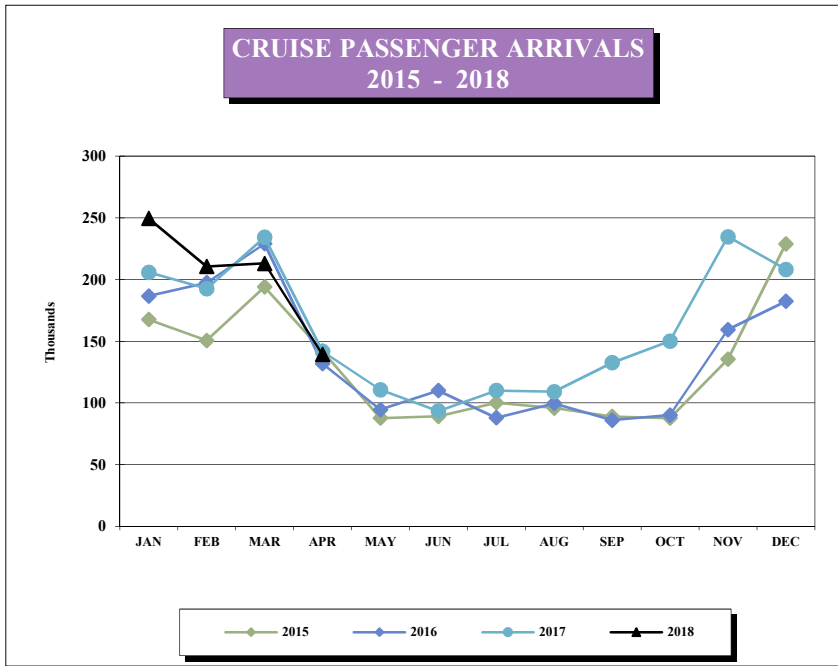

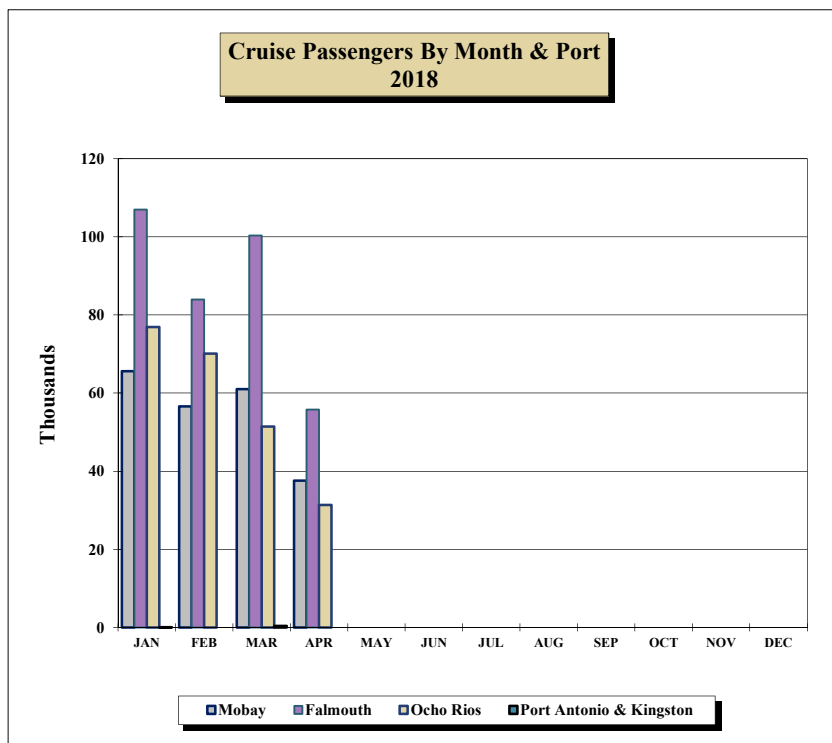

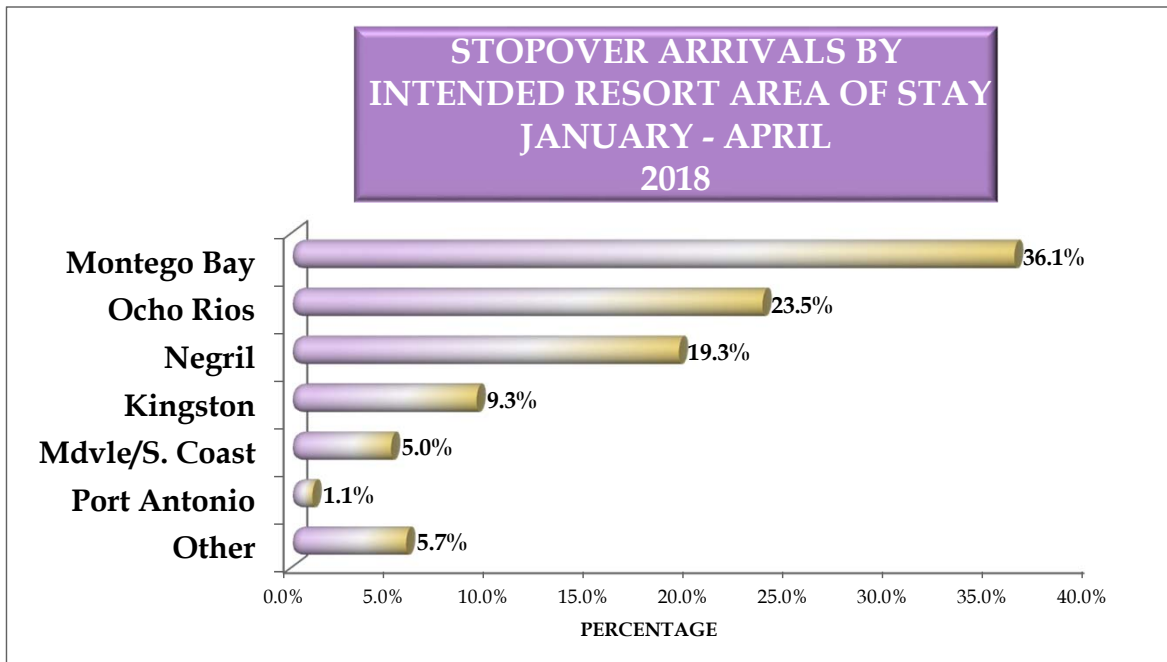
