During Carnival, the island comes together to embrace the vivacious spirit of Jamaica, with thousands of visitors, including locals and international attendees. In the lead up to Carnival, there are <u>weeklong parties and fetes</u> as part of the countdown celebrations to the main event, from the Black 2 Blue Breakfast Party on April 13th to the XS Sunset Beach Cool Down on the 17th.

The best way to truly be immersed in the celebrations is by joining a Mas Band. Mas bands, short for masquerade bands, are one of the biggest parts of Carnival. Masqueraders dress up and showcase their magnificent costumes, covered in feathers, glitter and plenty of color. Every year, <u>Mas Bands</u> will have a different theme and costumes to match. The bands in Carnival Jamaica 2023 are Bacchanal Ja, Yardmas, Xodus, Ochi Carnival, GenXs and Downtown Carnival. They all offer their own unique experiences, but whichever band a party goer chooses to join, being a part of Carnival is the best way to experience the occasion.
