JAMAICA ENTRY MEASURES EXTENDED THROUGH APRIL 2021

Dear Valued Partners,

The Government of Jamaica has announced that current guidelines will remain in place for an extended period through to **2021 April 15.** This extended timeline will allow for a more seamless experience as visitors plan their travel to Jamaica and is part of our continued effort to minimize the spread of COVID-19, while protecting the lives of our citizens and visitors.

In addition, a number of entities have been added to the approved list of compliant attractions, even though they are not located within the boundaries of the resilient Corridor. These attractions may be visited using transportation licensed under the JTB Act. The following attractions have now been added to the approved list:

- Chukka Caribbean YS Falls Zipline Canopy (St Elizabeth)
- Reach Falls (Portland)
- Joy Spence Appleton Rum Experience (St Elizabeth)
- Konoko Falls (St Ann)
- Chukka Caribbean Adventure at White River Valley (St Ann)
- Island Guly Falls (St Ann)
- Chukka Caribbean Adventure Tours at Good Hope (Trelawny)
- Paintball Jamaica (Trelawny)
- Animal Farm (Hanover)
- John's Hall Adventure Tours (St James)
- JamWest Adventure Park Ltd (Westmoreland)

Reminders:

- Visitors are allowed to do split stays within the Resilient Corridors.
- While Jamaica maintains nightly limitations on movement, airport transfers within the restricted hours will not be affected. If stopped, visitors may be asked to show their flight details.
- The current high risk countries are listed as Brazil, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Panama and the United States (all States).
- An "unfit to fly" notice will be issued to the airlines for persons who test positive while in Jamaica. Persons will be allowed to leave Jamaica using medical evacuation or private flights.
